### H. New Business

<u>Poole Tank Weather Station MOU with the State of New Hampshire</u> – This would be an automated, solar powered weather station that would be placed on Town property. The Town would be allowed to use weather services. All maintenance would be the responsibility of State.

On a motion by Belletete, seconded by Chamberlain, the MOU with the State of New Hampshire for the Poole Tank Weather Station was approved (3-0).

<u>Resolution #2021-05</u> – Withdrawal of Bridge Capital Reserve Funds - \$29, 281.96 On a motion by Belletete, seconded by Chamberlain, Resolution #2021-05 was approved (3-0).

<u>Resolution #2021-06</u> – Withdrawal of Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Funds - \$48,940This is to replace the 2012 sedan that wasn't completed last year. The price was negotiated down to \$34,301. The outfitting will be done with the regular company that has been used before. They received \$2,000 for a trade in from DPW. They would still need to withdraw \$47,940 to cover the vehicle and outfitting.

On a motion by Belletete, seconded by Chamberlain, Resolution#2021-06 was approved (3-0).

<u>Approval and Certification of the 2021 Warrant and Layman's Warrant</u> The warrant articles #1-31 were reviewed and approved at the January 25<sup>th</sup> Select Board Meeting.

Articles #32 through 41 were reviewed. Article # 41 for Reality Check is based on old census numbers. It was suggested that their request be based on the current census numbers and the amount adjusted. Mary Drew will be notified.

On a motion by Belletete, seconded by Chamberlain, Articles #32 to #41 were recommended (3-0) with new amount pending on #41.

Article #42 is a non-monetary request, therefore does not need BOS recommendation.

On a motion by Belletete, seconded by Chamberlain, The Warrant and Layman's Warrant were Approved and Certified (3-0).

### I. Reports to the Select Board Selectmen's Reports

<u>Sterling</u>- Budget Public Hearing was held via Zoom successfully last Saturday 2/6/2021. The budget was approved for \$6,494,493, which was a 1.48% decrease from last year. Chairman Sterling thanked the Budget Committee for their time and commitment.

<u>Chamberlain-</u>There is now a revised Broadband figure. The Broadband Committee will be reviewing this at their next meeting on February 19<sup>th</sup> and then pass along their findings to the BOS for the February 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting.
