A. Call to Order – 6:00pm

B. Pledge of Allegiance

C. Appointments –Paving Plan (Handout attached to these minutes)

Randy Heglin, DWP Director explained that this year's paving plan was presented at Budget Season time, making it clear that it would be re-evaluated in the Spring and make changes as needed.

- Ingalls Road Pave an additional 1,000 feet.
- Gilson Road Due to numerous complaints, the paver is in next week.
- Fitzwilliam Road Paving southerly toward Gap Mountain.
- Harkness Road- Addition- will finish that paving.
- Goodnow Street At the intersection with North Street, will reconfigure to a "T" intersection, will use overlay and seal.
- Bryant Road Will reclaim the road at the intersection with Proctor Road and will pave 100 feet of Woodbury Hill.
- Gilmore Pond Road DPW has been fixing road in sections. 89 potholes were patched over the winter. 4,100 feet has been reclaimed. They will be paving 500 feet on Peabody hill Road to stabilize the road and keep silt from building up.
- Aetna Street repairs will be in line with the sewer project and is slated for next year.
- Whitt Hill Road Taken off this year's list.

Director Heglin explained the process of the mapping of the pavement plan. Vans with cameras travelled all the roads. Once the videos were reviewed, the program calculates the state of the road and gives a value. The roads with the worst values would be evaluated for repair. However, the good roads would be maintained at the same time. This process was also done on the sidewalks, with a person walking the sidewalks and recording video.

Ingalls Road - Peter Chamberlain, a long-time resident of the road was disappointed to hear it had been pulled from the list once again this year. He stated that there are 28 houses on the road, 21 on the non-paved section. One section was paved to stabilize the road due to ground water seepage, however the remainder hasn't been paved. Due to the many homes being built on the road, the daily traffic exceeds the limits of the road, causing poor road conditions.

Selectman Belletete had asked if the total amount of funds to repair/maintain roads could be put into a long-term bond to bring all the roads up to date. This would have to go to the Select Board and Budget Committee and then on to Town Meeting and be approved.

Chairman Sterling assured Chamberlain that the Town is trying to get to Ingalls, but unfortunately other emergencies arise.

<u>Belletete-</u> Attended the Planning Board Workshop. Possible changes to the Land Use Ordinance were discussed to make rural areas denser with population.

<u>Chamberlain</u>- Attended the Vibrant Communities workshop regarding transportation, employment and housing. Surveys will be distributed, and they will gather and share information from the results.

Attended the New Officials training in Concord on Saturday. There was a lot of RSA information and he found it useful.

Town Manager's Report

- The Jaffrey 250th committee is looking for formal creation from the BOS. The celebration will be in 2023.
- There was a strategic planning meeting on May 31st with Millipore to learn more about needs and constraints with their extension project.
- Ocold Stone Springs There is a lack of understanding regarding the funding from DES. The collaboration of the 2 towns is confusing to them. There are specific guidelines that need to be followed according to the Trust Fund. Chamberlain asked about the sharing of the well. TM Frederick stated that there will be an advisory board for each town, capital will be divided, and the water users will be splitting the operating costs.
- o Saturday, June 15th from 9am to 1pm will be the WW Cross Visioning Workshop at the Jaffrey Civic Center.
- o Town Office will be closed at Noon on Friday June 14th for seasonal bug spraying. Staff must vacate the building for the afternoon.

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
