

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN OF JAFFREY ANNUAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT 2011

Elections – March 08, 2011 (8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.) Business Meeting – March 12, 2011 (9:00 a.m.)

TO: The inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Veterans of Foreign War, Post 5613 in said Jaffrey on Tuesday, the 8th of March, 2011 at eight o'clock in the forenoon (polls close at 7:00 p.m.) to vote for the town officers and to act on other questions as required by law to be decided by official ballot. Pursuant to RSA 39:2a and the vote of the Town at the adjourned session of Town Meeting on March 13, 1979 and the Town Meeting on March 13, 1993, the business portion of the meeting will be recessed until nine o'clock in the forenoon, Saturday, March 12th, 2011, at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium in Jaffrey, at which time the Town will act on all subjects described in the following Warrant Articles except those requiring action by official ballot:

Art. 1. To choose the following Town Officers: (by Official Ballot)

Selectman - three-year term- **Donald MacIsaac**Trustee of Trust Funds - three-year term- **Robert Stephenson**Library Trustee - three-year term- **Richard Porter**Town Clerk – three-year term- **Maria Chamberlain**Treasurer – three year term- **Sandra Stewart**

Due to the long lines for voters checking in with the Supervisors of the Checklist the meeting was called to order at 9:50 a.m.

The Moderator, Marc Tieger, asked the attendants to stand as the Boy Scouts from the Monadnock Troop (Daniel Campbell, Garrett Maki and Zachary Bergeron) presented the colors and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. After which Mr. Tieger asked everyone to remain standing as he read the following:



"Once again we come together to help guide and decide the business of the Town for the coming year. We are citizens with different philosophies and opinions and yet we are united in our common purpose – the continuing commitment to the well-being of this wonderful town which we are so fortunate to call home.

We come with heavy hearts and confused minds, as we observe world events. For some of us this anxiety is intensified as our sons and daughters, husbands and wives and our dear friends and town employees, have been called to the service of their country. Please know that our thoughts and prayers are with them, and with you, in these most difficult times. We also respect and understand the rights of those with differing opinions and we sympathize with them in their anguish. As we see world events unfold, once again we are reminded again of how fortunate we are to live in the United States of America where the rights of all are respected.

As we reflect on the losses our community has endured during the past year we re-affirm in silence our gratitude to those men and women of our community who are no longer with us. Let us pledge to honor their memories by continuing their tasks.

So let us listen and question, let us speak and debate with civility and respect, let us learn from others even as we put forth our own views and, when the meeting is over, let us leave with the knowledge that the tradition of our Jaffrey Town Meeting, and our participation in it, remains stronger than ever. Please join me in a few moments of silence mediation and reflection."

Mr. Tieger then asked everyone to be seated again. Mr. Tieger proceeded to introduce the front tables where the Selectmen, Town Manager, Department heads, Town Clerk and Budget Committee Chairman sat.

Mr. Tieger introduced his Assistant Moderator as Peter Lambert who would be moderating a few of the articles and overseeing the ballot boxes for secret ballot articles.

Mr. Tieger then recognized Chairman of the Board of Selectmen Don MacIsaac.

Before Mr. MacIsaac got started with the resolutions he wished to announce



that Tom Rothermel was awarded Volunteer of the Year at the towns annual volunteer dinner. There was then a round of applause.

Mr. MacIsaac then offered the following resolutions:

Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 12, 2011, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting."

"Whereas, Gus Harris served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and distinction as a member of the Community Center Committee;

Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 12, 2011, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting."

"Whereas, Lisa Record served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and distinction as a member of the Community Center Committee;

Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 12, 2011, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting."



The resolutions were accepted by acclamation.

After the applause for the above, Mr. MacIsaac concluded with the following:

"On behalf of the Board, I would like to offer a special recognition to a man who has brought a remarkable record of service to Jaffrey's Planning Board.

Dick Grodin was first appointed to the Planning Board in 1977; was chair from 1978-82. In fact, Dick was recognized in the 1990 Annual Report as follows: "The energy and sense of responsibility Mr. Grodin brought to his 'serving' played an important role in enhancing the quality-of-life in Jaffrey. He has consistently strived to make our Town a better place to work and live."

That's a remarkable accomplishment, but Dick still had more to do. In 1994 Dick rejoined the Planning Board, was chair again in 2002. Dick has decided that later this year he will step away from the Planning Board. Folks, that's 29 years service. Dick has certainly put his mark on our Town Ordinances and Regulations. It is for these 29 years of service that the Board proposes to recognize Dick with the following resolution:

"Whereas, the Jaffrey Board of Selectmen recognize Dick Grodin, in his retirement from the Planning Board;

Whereas, Dick Grodin has with honor and distinction served the citizens of Jaffrey;

Whereas, Dick Grodin served the Jaffrey Planning Board for twenty-nine years leaving a lasting imprint on Jaffrey's Zoning Ordinances and Regulations;

Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 12, 2011 that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made part of the official record of this meeting.

Mr. MacIsaac continued:

"Although Dick is stepping away, he has assured me that he will be available for consultations. The guy just loves this stuff!! Behind every passionate person, there is an equally tolerant sponsor. Edith Grodin deserves special mention for her willingness to share Dick's time with the Planning Board. Edith, as they say at the 19th hole, this bud's (rose bud in a vase) for you!! Thank you both."

As the assembly gave a standing ovation Mr. MacIsaac presented Mrs. Grodin with a rose bud in a vase.

Mr. Tieger then went over the basic rules ground rules and guidelines for how our town meeting is conducted. He recognized Town Counsel David Tower.

He also introduced the Mic Handlers: Sean McGlynn and Paul Kaufman who are Honor Society members from Conant High School.

Mr. Tieger also encouraged the assembly to partake in the food and beverages being sold in the lobby by the Fast Food group for the Jaffrey Fire Department.

Mr. Tieger made note that those who were elected on Tuesday were to be sworn in after the meeting.

Mr. Tieger thanked Don MacIsaac and Mark Kresge for the power point of the articles that we would be presented to us today.

Mr. Tieger proposed to waive reading of the Warrant in its entirety. It was so moved and seconded.

Mr. Tieger then read the results of Tuesday's voting.

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,100,000) for the construction of a combined Town Office Community Center to replace the existing Town Offices and to authorize the issuance of not more than Three Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,100,000) of bonds and notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33



et. seq.) as amended, and authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver such bonds or notes, and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof, and to take any other action the Board deems appropriate to effectuate the sale and/or issuance of said bonds and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid which may be available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project.

2/3 ballot vote required. Recommended by Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed the article.

After some questions, comments and options the question was moved to be voted upon. Mr. Tieger instructed the voters to use the "A" ballot. The polls were open for the required one hour, at 11:45 the results were as follows:

Yes – 64 No – 254

The article failed.

Art. 3. That all reports submitted by Town Officers be accepted as read and as printed in the Town Report.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed the article.

Jim Dumont wished to acknowledge Rob Stephenson for the outstanding picture for the cover. Marilyn Simons wished to point out that the Library hours on the back cover where incorrect (Friday and Saturday hours should be swapped around).

David Chamberlain wished to point out that there were two firefighters that were mentioned twice.

With no further discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Public Works Union, AFSCME Local 2973 that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 8. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.



Year 2011 Estimated Increase in Cost Items \$35,278

Selectwoman Kathy Batchelder moved and addressed the article. With no discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 5. Shall the Town, if Article 4 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 4 cost items only.

Since article 4 was passed a motion was made and seconded to pass over this article.

So carried.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Police Union, AFSCME Local 3657, that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 8. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

Year	Estimated Increase in Cost Items
2011	\$36,423

Selectwoman Jeanne LaBrie moved and addressed the article.

After some brief clarification and no other discussion the art

After some brief clarification and no other discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 7. Shall the Town, if Article 6 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 6 cost items only.

Since article 6 was passed a motion was made and seconded to pass over this article.

So carried.



Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,111,679 for general municipal operations. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed this article. The Budget Committee Chairman, Norm Langevin also addressed the article.

After many questions, comments and passionate statements the article was moved to a vote. Frank Sterling moved to request a standing vote.

Mr. Tieger reminded everyone that "only those registered voters" could vote. Mr. Tieger then asked that those in favor of the article to stand (count was taken), Mr. Tieger received the numbers from his counters, asked everyone to be seated and then asked that those who were opposed to please stand (while this count was being taken Pam Easton, a voting member of the assembly, interrupted with the question "how do we know these are registered voters?" Mr. Tieger said that once the counting was finished he would address that concern.

Mr. Tieger then announced the results as follows: Yes - 133 No - 122, Mr. Tieger said that to make sure that this was "done right" that they would do a second standing count but this time the registered voters would hold up their ballots. Kevin Sterling, was recognized to speak by the moderator, and who was in the back bleacher section, requested that they don't "double count" the back section. Pam Easton then interjected with "why is there not a secret ballot?" Mr. Tieger then said "tell you what we'll do- a secret ballot..Okay?" there was a lot of applause.

Mr. Tieger instructed everyone to use their "B" ballot (yes, in favor and no, not in favor). And that because the ballot box for Article two was in use because the polls were not yet closed for that question, that a ballot tote box (that was secured and attended to by the Deputy Town Clerk and Assistant Moderator) was the ballot box that was to be used for Article 8 voting. Mr. Tieger instructed the voters to hand their ballot to the attendant at the box. The results were as follows:

Yes- 117 No- 125

Mr. Tieger read these results before article 13.

He declared the article defeated.



Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be deposited into the Cemetery Trees Trust Fund established in 2007. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed the article. After one question the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to be deposited into the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund established in 2000. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

The current balance of the Town fund is \$6,321.71 and the private balance is \$517.15. During 2011 funds from this reserve were used to remove several trees in the Old Burial Grounds.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be deposited into the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund established in 2000. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Gravestone Restoration Fund, created in 2000 is used to repair and maintain stones that have been damaged or vandalized, specifically in those cases where a family member can't be found to assume the responsibility. The current balance is \$6,445.59.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be deposited into the Meeting House Trust Fund established in 1991. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Meetinghouse Fund was created in 1991. The current balance is \$ 17.547.86

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$22,400 from the Property Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund for purposes of conducting the second segment of a four year property revaluation program in 2012. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: Under state law the Town is required to conduct a town-wide property revaluation every five years. The law allows towns to conduct revaluation on a phased basis. The Selectmen have determined that the revaluation due in 2015 will be done on a phased in basis reviewing ¼ of the town each year (2011 thru 2014), with a statistical revaluation completed in 2015. This will ensure that each property is visited and properly assessed. This article will provide funds to complete the second year of the program.



Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$15,000 to be deposited into the Municipal Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund established in 2009 under the provisions of RSA 35:1 and to further name the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund in the best interest of the Town or to take any action thereon. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. The Building Maintenance Capital Reserve was created upon the recommendation of both the Capital Improvements Plan committee and the Municipal Facilities Committee in 2009, for the purpose of funding major building maintenance needs. Authorizing the Selectmen as agents will allow the Board to expend funds in the event of an emergency such as a total failure of the heating system in a Town building.

Art.14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50,000 and to deposit said sum into the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve fund established in 1997 under RSA 35:1 for the purpose of purchasing new or refurbishing highway equipment. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. By putting a portion of anticipated costs aside, a large jump in the tax rate or the need to borrow will be avoided. It is anticipated that the department will need to purchase a new end-loader next year.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$238,000, with the source of funds being \$12,000 from the capital reserve fund established in 1996 for the purchase of new or refurbishing existing firefighting and/or rescue equipment and \$226,000 from an Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to be used to purchase new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). The \$12,000 from the reserve fund will be utilized as the Town's 5% share of the total cost of the equipment. In the event the grant is not awarded the department shall be authorized to utilize the funds appropriated for the purchase of SCBA bottles to replace existing bottles that are in need of replacement. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.



LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Fire Department has applied for Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to assist with the purchase of Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), as the current units in service are outdated and the bottles used are at the end of their useful lifespan. If awarded the grant the Town share would be 5% or \$12,000. The Town is required to appropriate the entire cost of the equipment in order to spend the funds if the grant application is successful. In the event the grant is not approved the department is requesting that the funds be used to start replacing the existing SCBA bottles. There is currently a balance of \$83,559 in the reserve account.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$5,000 to be deposited into the Land Acquisition Capital Reserve Fund established in 2008 under the provisions of RSA 35:1. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article will place \$5,000 into the Land Acquisition Capital Reserve for future purchase of land or conservation easements.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200,000 to upgrade the Library and additionally, to relocate some Town offices to the library's 2nd floor. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article funds the upgrade of the heating system at the library, as recommended in the Turner Report and identified in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan. It also funds renovations to the 2nd floor of the library to allow the relocation of some of the Town Offices to the library. The Selectmen view the relocation to be temporary until such time that a new building can be funded. The renovations will permanently improve the Library and enhance its ability to serve its patrons in the long run.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Stone Arch Bridge Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.



LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD encompasses all of the Industrial District which is bordered by Route 202 along Nutting Rd. and extending south toward Turnpike Rd. The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD funds the bond payments for the intersection and bridge improvements from Route 202 onto Old Sharon Rd. Engineering for the construction of the water main to serve the district is complete. DPW and the EDC are working with USEDA to secure funding for the construction.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Downtown Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Downtown TIFD includes the Downtown District and the Main Street program area. The TIFD supports Team Jaffrey, the bond for the community center site, and the provision of matching funds for the ongoing remediation at the former Elite Laundry site. Also included in the TIF plan are the construction costs for the downtown dam repairs and support for the planning of community facilities within the district.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for support of the Jaffrey-Rindge Memorial Ambulance, a non-profit agency or take any action relating there to. Submitted by petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 for the support of the Monadnock Community Early Learning Center, a non-profit agency, or take any other action relating thereto. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.



Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,170 for the support of the Monadnock Family Services, or take any other action relating thereto. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$17,000 to support HCS – Home Healthcare, Hospice and Community Services to support the continuance of visiting nursing services being provided to the residents of Jaffrey. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500 to The Community Kitchen, Inc. in Keene, NH. for services provided to Jaffrey residents. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800 to Southwestern Community Services, Inc., a private non-profit, multi-service, anti-poverty agency. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 to the Jaffrey Civic Center to help support its ongoing community activities and events. Submitted by petition. Not Recommended by the Selectmen and Not Recommended by the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article.



Art. 27. We the citizens of Jaffrey petition the Town to design and implement a plan which successfully places the Town of Jaffrey in the next four years without raising rates to achieve that of the state average of water and sewer municipalities in the state of New Hampshire. And to remain for at least 5 years.

Submitted by Petition.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article.

Art. 28. We the citizens petition that the town return to a more fiscal responsible community. Through responsible spending that will effectively remove us from one of the top highest property tax rate in the state of New Hampshire to that of the state average or lower within the next two years. And remain for at least 5 years. Submitted by Petition.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article.

Art. 29. To see if the Town of Jaffrey shall prohibit vote counting concealed from the human eye by computerized voting machines, tabulators, or other electronic devices, and require that all methods used for sorting and counting the votes in all elections be publically observable for full citizen oversight of the entire voting system. (The secrecy of vote casting shall be maintained.)

Submitted by Petition.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article.

Art. 30. To take up any other business which may come legally before this meeting.

Indefinite Delegation of Authority

Indefinite Delegation of Authority



Prior to 1999, a number of articles appeared on the Town Warrant each year delegating specific powers to the Board of Selectmen and the Library Trustees. These articles are usually referred to as "boilerplate articles." During the 1999 annual meeting, Jaffrey's citizens voted (Articles 32-38) to "authorize indefinitely, until specific recision of such authority" the Selectmen and the Library Trustees to undertake various actions and, therefore, to no longer include these articles on future Town Meeting Warrants. The Town of Jaffrey now has seven such warrant articles, which are listed below for your reference:

1) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS

REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER FINANCIAL REPORTING AND ON COMPLIANCE AND OTHER MATTERS BASED ON AN AUDIT OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PERFORMED IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS

To the Board of Selectmen Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2010, which collectively comprise the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's basic financial statements and have issued our report thereon dated August 29, 2011. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Town's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.



Reports Boards, Commissions and Committees



Board of Selectmen



We would like to start this report from your Select Board, by thanking the citizens of Jaffrey. Each year you accept responsibility to make our community viable, welcoming and well governed. You volunteer for town committees, come to Town Meeting, vote in national, state and local elections, support local businesses and non-profits and work together to make a future for our children. We hope that you will continue this work into 2012. The Jaffrey Board of Selectmen is grateful.

2011 delivered many unexpected events: a hurricane, a delayed budget process, and an early snowstorm. It also was the year when new projects began to take shape. Some of these projects are as follows:

- Partial restoration of the Main St. dam has been begun. As soon as the water level recedes we will install the new gates and complete the project.
- The Gilmore Pond bridge (culvert) reconstruction is in progress. Delays in permitting and weather challenges have moved the completion to 2012.
- The Rt. 202 bypass project remains on the latest DOT 10-Year plan.
 The Town's Economic Development Council, in partnership with
 Franklin Pierce University, hosted "Downtown Dialogues" and will
 continue to seek broad-based input and support. We anticipate getting
 a "Safe Routes To School" grant to study further safety improvements.
- Elite Laundry clean-up is progressing well and the Town is hoping to develop the site moving forward.
- Squantum Well is on schedule to come on line in 2012.
- Our latest grant application for funding of the Stone Arch water line
 was submitted for judgment at yearend. We remain optimistic we can
 fund this project through grant(s) and the TIFD.
- We are hopeful that in 2012, our economy will grow and allow us to invest in Jaffrey's infrastructure and support the work that is already in progress. The coming year will present new challenges.

As we move forward, the Select Board will work diligently to try and balance the consequences of cuts made at state and county levels to our local funding. It will be a difficult task but one that must be faced.

This will be the first year the Town will experience the impact of financing our new Waste Water Treatment Facility. In an effort to offset the loss of

the promised \$8M State Aid Grant funding, we have arranged a loan of 25 years. Unfortunately for a town this size, the impact is still significant.

In an effort to minimize the tax impact of our WWTF debt spending, we will again push out a significant amount of important capital spending. We, as a town, must recognize that this will affect the quality of our infrastructure and will not be sustainable. Our roads, facilities and equipment are key to the level of service that you expect from the Town.

In 2012, it will become the responsibility of the Town to fund the cost for Fire and Ambulance Mutual Aid. In the past, the taxes paid to Cheshire County supported this contract. The Cheshire County Commissioners informed the town this fall that will no longer be the case. We will work to recoup those dollars from the County budget.

As we work together to face our future, we would like to thank you for your continued support, advice and assistance.

Town Moderator



One of the most important responsibilities of the Moderator is overseeing of the elections. This year we have four elections: the (National) primary, town elections (March 17), the (State) primary elections (September 11), and the General election (November 6). Recent events in both our State Legislature and the media have raised concerns about the integrity of our elections; the accuracy of our electronic voting machines, the possibility of voter fraud, and whether our election process is what most of us think it is and should be. We are very fortunate in Jaffrey to have outstanding people who are involved in this process.

Our Town Clerk, Maria Chamberlain, is extremely knowledgeable, conscientious, and personable. Our (elected) Supervisors of the Checklist take their job very seriously. They meet throughout the year for voter registration and changes to the checklist, register new voters, and maintain the checklist. As with many other aspects of life today, the requirements of the Federal and State government have made what was once a less demanding job, much more complicated and time consuming.

Finally we have the wonderful folks who work at the polls, handing out the ballots and helping voters. There are two inspectors of the election appointed by the chair of each of the two major parties. They are aided by ballot clerks, one from each of the two major parties, and appointed by the party chair. Our polls open at 8:00 AM and close at 7:00 PM and our polling place, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 5613, has proven to work very well. I'd like to thank not only the people in the positions previously mentioned, but also my Assistant Moderator Jeanne LaBrie, Deputy Town Clerk and Tax Collector Dawn Oswalt, and Assistant Moderator Peter Lambert for their tireless dedication to our election process. Also Steve Rigopoulous of Steve's Lettering, the Moderator's Advisory Committee, Roy and Nancy Stone, the Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce, and the party chairs. Thank you, too, to the voters who have contacted me with their comments and concerns. Being the Moderator is an honor of which I am very proud, and I am appreciative of your confidence and ongoing support.

Gemetery Committee



THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE was established in 1991 to advise the Town on the operation, maintenance and preservation of Jaffrey's public cemeteries: Conant, The Old Burying Ground, Cutter, Cutter Extension and Phillips-Heil (also the inactive cemeteries, Village and Smallpox). It is composed of representatives of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Historical Society, Cournoyer Funeral Home, the Board of Selectmen and up to five appointed Members at Large. Randall Heglin, Director of Public Works, and Bruce Hautanen assist the Committee in its work. The *Resolution* establishing the Committee and the *Cemetery Rules and Regulations* are on the Town's website: http://townofjaffrey.com

During 2011 the Committee met four times with Town staff to discuss operation, budget and maintenance issues, or to undertake inspections. Each cemetery is overseen by a member of the Committee. This oversight involves inspecting the cemetery from time-to-time and reporting on conditions and problems at Committee meetings. Members of the Committee also participated in several work sessions to 1) straighten headstones; 2) continue the restoration of the cast iron fence surrounding John Conant's grave; and 3) record and photograph the gravestones in Conant Cemetery (800 completed, 500 yet to be done), in Cutter Cemetery and in the Old Burying Ground.

Katsura Landscaping continues to do an excellent job of grass cutting, cleanup and grounds maintenance at all the cemeteries. Andrew Webber

replaced the sill of the Hearse House at Village Cemetery and repaired the wood-rail fence at the entrance, while Green Side Fence Co. repaired the chain link fencing that had been damaged by a falling tree.

A Cemetery Trees Trust Fund was established at the 2007 Town Meeting. At last year's Town Meeting, \$3,000 was added to the fund. (In addition \$500 in private contributions have been received.) \$5,100 was expended in 2011 to pay for the removal of six very old maples in the Old Burying Ground and for grinding the stumps. These trees had exceeded their expected life spans and posed a threat to the surrounding historic headstones. Additional trees including very large white pines will be removed in 2012 if the logistics of the removal can be safely worked out. The balance of the Trust Fund now stands at ca. \$9,300.

Minor gravestone repairs and stone straightening were done by volunteers. The large Gilmore obelisk in the Old Burying Ground, which was dangerously leaning, was moved, a foundation added and moved back in place by John Kaufhold of Peterborough Marble & Granite. He repaired as well several broken headstones in the Old Burying Ground and Conant Cemetery. The costs of these (\$750) were borne by the *Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund*, the balance of which now stands at nearly \$7,500. At last year's Town Meeting, \$1,000 was added to the fund. More stone straightening and resetting is planned for the Old Burying Ground and Village Cemetery in 2012. Also the Bradley monument in Conant Cemetery will be thoroughly cleaned by John Kaufhold (there is a dedicated fund created by Mark S. Bradley for this work).

Phase VI of the volunteer effort of restoring the iron fencing surrounding John Conant's grave at the cemetery named for him was undertaken by members of the Committee. One and a half sections were scraped and painted. The completion of this project is now in sight. The goal in 2012 is to finish another two sections.

It is expected that a new storage shed will be purchased for Conant Cemetery in 2012, paid for with proceeds from the Bradley Trust.

Residents and lot owners are reminded that the Town's Cemetery Rules & Regulations and A Guide to the Public Cemeteries of Jaffrey are available from the Department of Public Works and on the Town website. The Cemetery Committee has a page on the site under Town Government,

Committees/Commissions. More content was added or expanded during 2011 (inventories and photographs of graves in the Old Burying Ground, Phillips-Heil and Village Cemeteries). Information on some but not all graves in Jaffrey is available on www.jaffreyhistory.org.

The Monadnock and Dublin Garden Clubs— in observance of the Garden Club of America's centennial in 2013—are taking on Cutter Cemetery as a project. The intention is to enhance this cemetery's distinctive sugar maple allées. Trees that have long gone will be replaced in 2012. Cuttings from the original trees are now being propagated in a temporary nursery in Cutter Extension. The clubs have been successful in raising funds for trees and the Committee is appreciative of their efforts and looks forward to admiring the results.

During 2011, Andy Roy, an experienced slate letter carver, and Emily Preston joined the Committee as a representative of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and a member-at-large, respectively. The Committee welcomes their participation.

The Committee thanks those volunteers who have shown an interest in Jaffrey's cemeteries by devoting their time and attention to their care and maintenance over the past year.

Conservation Commission



The Conservation Commission was established in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 36-A for the proper use and protection of Jaffrey's natural resources and watersheds. The Commission provides a focal point within the town and its government for environmental concerns, joined in 2007 by the Energy Committee. The Commission may advise the Planning Board and other local bodies on conservation matters. The Commission may act more directly to protect natural resources by acquiring land, either outright or through easements, with the approval of the Selectmen. The Commission also manages designated town forests.

2011 was a planning and building year for the Conservation Commission in several ways. Several members of the commission enrolled in training classes offered by the Monadnock Conservancy and the University of New Hampshire. These included a Forest Laws Workshop and Conservation Leadership Training. These courses provided members with a great deal of knowledge about the roles, goals and approaches to managing and protecting open spaces and encouraging responsible public use of our local conservation areas such as Children's Woods and Cheshire Pond.

The commission contributed to a number of projects during the year. These included the sponsorship of a Jaffrey student at Camp Wildwood, participation in planning and fundraising for the Shattuck Farm easement and other activities described in more detail below.

Activities during the year included:

- 1. Building of kiosks and an accurate trail map for Children's Woods and Carey Park. The kiosks will be installed in the spring of 2012 and the maps will be available on the Town of Jaffrey website, as well as in information boxes at the kiosks in Children's Woods. Bird houses and duck boxes were also purchased and will be installed at Children's Woods in the spring
- 2. Participation and planning in conjunction with the Monadnock Conservancy for the easement on the Shattuck Farm. This is a scenic and historic working farm with over half a mile of scenic frontage along Great Road and Fitzwilliam Road. There are five hay fields totaling about 23 acres, about 10 acres of wetlands, and the balance being forested. The most compelling aspects of this project are connecting already protected lands on both sides of the property, protection of important soils, and preserving the scenic view along the roads.
- 3. Acquisition of two weed/brush management tools that are available

for free use by any town resident wishing to use them for the control of invasive species on their property.

- 4. Sponsorship of an Eagle Scout project to improve access at the Cheshire Pond Conservation area and to build a trail sign and kiosk at the entrance on Nutting Road.
- 5. Coordination with the Nature Conservancy and the Monadnock Conservancy to transition the ownership of Whittemore Island (in Thorndike Pond) from the Nature Conservancy to the Town of Jaffrey. The town will take ownership of the island in 2012.
- 6. Participation in the 2011 Riverfest with demonstrations of invasive species and presentation of Natural Resources Inventory maps
- 7. Participation in deliberations on the establishment of an Open Space Committee for the Town.
- 8. Adoption of the Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) into the Town Master Plan by the Planning Board. The NRI will be used in conjunction with other planning tools in ensuring that the Planning Board deliberations reflect the goals of the Town Master Plan.
- 9. Routine tasks included monitoring the following environmental activities: wetland permit applications, the easement on Gray Goose Farm, and several timber harvests and construction projects in town. The Commission also assisted landowners seeking funds for a conservation easement and citizens with conservation questions.

Commission member James Bearse left the commission in the fall of 2011, and he was replaced by Nancy Beiter who joined the commission in October of 2011.

Going forward into 2012, the Commission has the following aspirations:

- 1. Ensure that individual Commission members gain expertise in and take responsibility for specific conservation areas.
- 2. Enhance public education with the production and distribution of a brochure that explains clearly the role and responsibility of the Commission.
- 3. Improve coordination with other Town Committees and Boards.
- 4. Continue to improve the information that is presented on the town website.
- 5. Identify conservation related programs that can be made available to the public.

The Commission welcomes participation by Jaffrey citizens in its deliberations and activities. It also encourages inquiries and suggestions. The town website contains the schedule of meetings and approved minutes of past meetings, as does the bulletin board at the Town Offices. Relevant documents may also be found on the town website, including the Natural Resources Inventory, the Management Plan for the Cheshire Pond Conservation Area, the Baseline Documentation Report for Gray Goose Farm, and the 2005 Cost of Community Services Study.

The Economic Development Council (EDC) is made up of business people, community leaders, and local residents with an interest in promoting the economic vitality and growth of Jaffrey. The EDC is committed to promoting business friendly policies and creating business and job opportunities which build on our retail and manufacturing base. Priorities for this year included planning for pedestrian improvements in the downtown area, continued partnership with NH DOT on the route 202/124 traffic project, and developing a more formal marketing plan for the TIF Districts.

After many years of service, the EDC regretfully accepted the resignation of Jim Dumont.

This spring and early summer has brought several business expansions in town. Millipore and Teleflex have added personnel and are planning minor changes in their site plans. The Bradco Nine building (former Somero building) has been adding additional businesses as leased space. The Printegra building was recently purchased and the new owners are leasing available space there as well.

The EDC, Planning Board and TEAM Jaffrey continued out-reach and planning for downtown through a series of public forums "Downtown Dialogues" facilitated through the Center for Civic Life at Franklin Pierce University. The dialogues were structured to address issues raised by the public in prior workshops



regarding the route 202/124 "dogleg" traffic improvements, development of Community Field, and pedestrian safety. Each discussion focused on a particular concern; roundabout and bridge design, streetscape and tax base expansion, pedestrian and bicycle accessibility, and a final conversation on finding common ground. The results of the dialogues will be available on the Town website and through the EDC office. While the traffic improvement project is on the State's 10 year transportation plan, the EDC recognizes the importance of gaining consensus and creating a comprehensive plan for downtown.





remediation The Elite at Laundry has made significant progress this year. Through the use of the supplemental funding through the NH DES program, Brownfields biochemical treatment within the trench system on site and in the wells closest to and immediately down-gradient from the source area has been initiated. At this

time injection events have been budgeted on a three to six month interval. Monitoring reports and results are available on the Town web site, the Library and at the EDC office. As the site work has come to a close, the properties will be available for redevelopment. The EDC and Selectmen are working toward a reuse plan for the site.

Tax Increment Financing Districts Downtown TIFD:

The Downtown TIFD continues its support of TEAM Jaffrey. Projects this year included the traffic improvements to the route 202/124 "dogleg"; matching funding for the EPA grant for the Elite Laundry cleanup, engineering costs for the downtown dam repairs, support for the planning for the Community Facility, and bond payments on the purchase of Community Field.



Energy Committee



Noteworthy Energy Committee developments in 2011 included the following:

Carbon/Energy Challenge: In 2011, the Town participated in a town-wide Carbon/Energy Challenge in competition with Rindge and Temple. In doing this, Jaffrey joined in the New England Carbon Challenge, a joint project of the University of New Hampshire and Clean Air-Cool Planet. In the end, Temple won the competition achieving a higher percentage of participating households than either Jaffrey or Rindge. The Jaffrey Energy Committee deemed the project a success, however, in that 37 Jaffrey households did in fact access and use the Carbon Challenge on-line household energy planning tool at www.myenergyplan.net.

NH Energy and Technical Assistance Planning (ETAP) project: As a result of contacts initiated by the Energy Committee, and with the support of the Jaffrey Select Board, the Town of Jaffrey is now benefiting from participation in the New Hampshire Energy and Technical Assistance Planning for NH Communities (ETAP) program administered by the Southwest Regional Planning Commission. The project includes collection of historical municipal energy data in a format that then may be assessed using a sophisticated comparative assessment energy inventory tool that has been developed by Peregrine Energy Group. The project also includes an energy assessment of the Town Library and preparation of a draft technical assistance report by Peregrine. All ETAP services are free to the Town of Jaffrey.

Support for a new regional energy resource initiative: With the support and participation of energy committees throughout the Monadnock region, including the Jaffrey Energy Committee, initial meetings were held in late 2011 to see if an initiative similar to the very successful Plymouth Area Regional Energy Initiative (PAREI) program could be organized for the Monadnock region. PAREI has installed many solar hot water systems at homes throughout the Plymouth region using a professionally-directed community "barn raising" model. A Monadnock initiative would likely include weatherization and educational projects in addition to solar installations. The initial organizing meetings have been promising. Further development and implementation of this project in 2012 is expected.

Energy Committee



The purposes to be served by the Committee Goals and Objectives: are set forth in Article II of its By-Laws as follows: "The Jaffrey Energy Committee, acting as advisor to town officials, the schools, businesses and residents on energy matters, will seek to encourage energy conservation and sustainability (and to save money wherever possible) through the wise use of energy, giving special attention to minimizing carbon dioxide emissions, fossil fuel dependency, and wasteful energy consumption while maximizing clean renewable energy use. Among numerous critical energy challenges and opportunities, the Committee shall advocate: reduction of energy and environmental waste through smart recycling; reduction of carbon and other harmful fuel emissions through technological innovations and through shifts to alternative energy sources that minimize fossil fuel dependency; reduction of costs of residential, commercial and town lighting through elimination of unnecessary lighting, use of low energy lighting sources, and good lighting management practices; reduction of heating and air conditioning costs in buildings by maximizing energy conservation and efficiency and other performance factors; increase of energy efficiency through reformed building and property development codes; collaboration with other local, state and national organizations, including other town energy committees, to advance the above-stated purposes."

Committee organization: Members of the Committee at the close of 2011 were Harry Young (Chair), Richard Ames (Vice-Chair), Doug Clayton, Margaret Dillon, Rob Stephenson, Douglas Starr and Kevin Lenzo. The Committee encourages all those interested in participating in the work of the Committee to come to the Committee's meetings (times and locations are posted) or to contact its Chair for further information. Historic District Committee



The Jaffrey Historic District Commission was established by the citizens in 1969 to safeguard the heritage of Jaffrey Center by a) preserving a district that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history, b) conserving property values in the district, c) fostering civic beauty, and d) promoting the use of a historic district for education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens.

In the year 2011, the Historic District Commission met 9 times to discuss business relating to the Commissions ordinance to "regulate the construction, alteration, painting, moving, demolition, or use of the structures and places" within the district. No formal applications were filed. The Commission held one informational Public Hearing on a CLG Grant.

The Commission applied for and received a CLG Grant to have a walking tour of the Squantum Village created. This will be a self guided tour that will complement two previous self guided tours, one of Downtown Jaffrey and the other of Jaffrey Center.

The Commission co-sponsored the annual event of a reading of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th at the Meetinghouse which was well attended by Jaffrey residents as well as many people from surrounding towns.

The Commission would like to extend its sincere thanks to the residents and neighbors of the District for cooperating and considering the impact any changes to their homes and businesses might have on the overall character of the Historic District.

The Commission would like to thank the Selectmen's Meetinghouse Committee for the continuing coordination and ongoing restoration of the Meetinghouse

All residents are reminded that the Historic District Commission's regular monthly meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month at 7pm. Winter meetings are held in the Town Office; summer meetings are in the Meetinghouse.

Have you visited the library from your home computer yet? We have completed one full year using our web-based automated system which is available 24/7. Patrons can view new additions to the collection, request and renew items and receive updates and notices by email. All you need for access is the barcode number on your library card. If you don't have a card or can't find yours, please call the library or stop by and request one. Our web-site continues to feature access to our catalog, databases, and upcoming events. Check it out at www.jaffreypubliclibrary.org. Ancestry Library Edition database, an excellent source for researching genealogy, continues to be accessible but only through the computers in the library. We continue to participate in the "Downloadable Audio Program" offered by the New Hampshire State Library. The program expanded recently to include the Amazon Kindle. Information about this service is available at http://nh.lib.overdrive.com or through our library website.

The Mildred Cutter bequest and Page Fund enabled us to present our Summer Reading program, along with other special programs and material for children. Encouraging reading in our younger users is a high priority at the library. Our staff visits area daycare centers, preschools, and public schools to offer our resources and services. The annual Summer Reading Program encouraged kids to "Paws to Read". 130 kids read and listened to books for a total of 2,586 hours!

We are working with the ACCESS program which in underway at the Jaffrey Grade School and the Jaffrey-Rindge Middle School to provide afterschool programs.

The Friends of the Library helped us by fund raising and by sponsoring speakers, educational events, and the film series. Highlights included an informative presentation about coyotes by Chris Schadler, a discussion with Mike Tougias about his book "Overboard" and the "Great Classics in 90 minutes" by the Penumbia Players.

The circulation of materials in 2011 increased to 52,390. The use of the public access internet remained popular with 6,379 people using our computers, and 650 wireless users in the library. In April we started a new monthly book discussion group at the library. The group meets on Mondays at 2 PM and has been growing steadily, and new members are always welcome. Our knitting group meets every Friday at 10:30 in the

Bean Room. Tips on knitting, crocheting, and many crafts are plentiful. The film discussion series led by Bill Johnson continues to meet every Wednesday evening to a full house.

During this year we were able to make several needed repairs to the library building. We completed work on gutters and downspouts that will remedy water problems on the lower level. We also replaced the worn and torn carpet in the periodical room.

We are thankful for the support of the Town of Jaffrey and for the many gifts and donations we receive from individuals and community organizations. In 2012, we look forward to continuing to provide you with library service that meets your needs.

Meetiņghouse Gommittee





THE MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE advises the Town on matters pertaining to the use and maintenance of Jaffrey's historic Meetinghouse.

The Meetinghouse served as a venue for many events between May and October 2011: Amos Fortune Forum (seven lectures), Monadnock Music (four concerts), Conant High School's 19th annual Shakespeare Festival, the 95th annual First Church Fair, and two weddings, a national Willa Cather conference, a flower show sponsored by the Dublin and Monadnock Garden Clubs, the annual

meeting of the Monadnock Conservancy, one Downtown Series concert relocated because of rain and a session of Camp Quest. In August the newly cleaned and restored Grange curtain was lowered for the annual meeting of Jaffrey Historical Society. In September a Moderators' Forum was organized by the moderators of Dublin, Rindge and Jaffrey and all four State Representatives appeared for an evening of civic discussion. Several Town boards and committees met in the Meetinghouse one or more times. The Meetinghouse was also the scene of numerous other meetings, school group visits, and gatherings throughout the year. The Committee along with the Jaffrey Historical Society, the Village Improvement Society and the Historic District Commission cosponsored the 11th annual reading of The Declaration of Independence on the Fourth of July. The Meetinghouse was again full and the 38 volunteer readers did a marvelous job. All are invited to attend and participate.

The Committee made thorough inspections of the Meetinghouse in May and October. Between these inspections a variety of projects were undertaken, sometimes by members of the Committee and at other times by volunteers or contractors: Inspection and servicing of the Town clock (largely done by Charles Marvin with the assistance of Kevin Sterling and with the professional involvement of D'Avanza Clock Repair of Goffstown); annual testing of the fire alarm system; and the usual touch-up interior painting, oiling of exterior stairs and ramps and minor plumbing and electrical repair.

Among the major projects in 2011: Dennis Wright continued the phased painting of the windows and completed the painting of the west end and

tower. Andrew Webber rebuilt the front of the stage including the removal of the non-functioning foot lights. The entire stage floor was then sanded, stained and poly-urethaned by Ron Cormier. Felt pads were placed on the feet of all the benches; and six new fire extinguishers were purchased and installed.

In 2012 the window painting will have been completed. Two major undertakings will be the replacement of the antiquated electric panel by Shea Electrical and the painting of the ceiling by Dennis Wright. (As best can be determined this major project was last done in 1922.) And the ramp leading to the Tower door will be rebuilt by Andrew Webber.

For the sixth year a Christmas tree was installed on the Common and a lighting ceremony with caroling was held on December 4th. As always, candles were set in the south windows of the Meetinghouse for the holiday season.

The Meetinghouse has its own webpage, hosted on the Town's website at http://town.jaffrey.nh.us. Go to >Town Government > Committees/ Commissions > Meetinghouse Committee. Here you will find historical information, photographs, the current and past schedules of events, and the application and guidelines for use.

The calendar for next season is beginning to fill. Other than the usual events, five weddings have already been booked. These and other private gatherings benefit the Town through rental fees.

Monadnock Advisory Commission



The Monadnock Advisory Commission was created by State Statute and is charged to advise and guide the Department of Resources and Economic Development on the management of State lands on Monadnock, Gap and Little Monadnock Mountains. State law allows the Commission to accept tax-deductible donations. MAC is a primary funding source for search and rescue supplies and equipment.

Hiking attendance was down slightly but the extended foliage season enabled folks to enjoy autumn hiking longer. In addition, minimal snowfall has increased hiker attendance reflected in figures showing more hikers in November than April. Iron Ranger donations continue to increase on Dublin, Marlborough and Gap Mountain trails.

Gilson Pond Campground was open for the first full year. Campers are enthusiastic about the park reflected in an increase of 1,360 camper days. Headquarters Campground is still frequented by many hikers.

Hurricane Irene caused a total closure of Monadnock State Park in August. It was the second time in less than three years that a storm has resulted in a complete park closure.

The MERE project, Monadnock Ecological Research and Education project, under the auspices of Antioch University professor Peter Palmiotto, continues. This was the second year of the Summit Stewardship program, which educates hikers on alpine vegetation around the summit. An outreach community program with Keene High School assisted with mountain research. It is hoped that additional schools in the region take part in this program in the future.

Supervisors of the Checklist



2011 was the Year of "The Purge". Every ten years, registered voters who have not voted in an election in the last 4 years are removed from the towns' checklists state-wide. The computerized system, ElectioNet, created in 2007 facilitated the process of verifying the election history of all voters. Begun in April, the Purge was completed by the end of August. Jaffrey Supervisors spent one-third of their work sessions engaged in activities related to the Purge. About one in five Jaffrey voters (27%) on the Checklist at the start of the year were shown to have not voted in the last 4 years and were removed. At the end of the Purge process and the year, the number of eligible voters in Jaffrey was 2,958. Nearly 40% of the town's voters have not declared a party affiliation (Undeclared). Those declaring Republican and Democrat party affiliations are within 2 voters of being exactly the same, 927 and 929 respectively.

The Town/School District election was the only election in 2011. Supervisors also participated in three other meetings: SAU Deliberative Session, Town Meeting and one Special Town Meeting. Supervisors relied on the assistance of former Supervisors Sylvia Hamilton and Betts Balentine to process the Town's Special Meeting in May. Carolyn Saari was appointed Supervisor after Town Meeting in March, and stands for election in 2012. During 2011, Supervisors spent 231 person hours maintaining the Voter Checklist, accomplishing The Purge, and providing oversight at meetings and elections, and the Special Town Meeting in May. Supervisors also certified signatures on petitioned articles for the Town Warrant.

Supervisors of the Checklist



Supervisors of the Checklist, elected officials of the Town, are governed by RSAs and report to the Secretary of State's Office regularly. Supervisors are responsible for the integrity of the voting process and maintain the Town's portion of the state-wide voter checklist in an online, dedicated file protected by passwords and restricted access. Elected for 6 year terms, Supervisors meet in regular sessions to update the Checklist, participate in Town Meetings, SAU Deliberative Sessions and all local, state, and national elections. Supervisors also certify signatures on petitioned articles to the Town Warrant and nominations for state and federal offices. The current Voter Checklist is available on the Town Clerk's bulletin board. Voters may register or make changes to their own records with the Town Clerk during normal business hours or by attending any of the Sessions held throughout the year by Supervisors.

This past year has been an interesting one in relative to the operations of the town. As a result of the uncertainty and delay in the passage of the budget, many of the projects that we had hoped to complete during 2011 were started but not completed. Projects delayed and now underway include the Main Street Dam, replacement of the culvert on Gilmore Pond Road, and restoration work on both the library lawn and the common, These projects will be completed during 2012. In addition development of the Squantum Road well continues on schedule and will be completed in 2012.

During the year the Town completed construction of the waste water filtration building including the installation of the equipment necessary to complete the filtration process. The project also included the installation of two pellet boilers which are now the plant's primary source of heat. This project was funded through a 50% grant from the ARRA (American Recovery & Reinvestment Act). The new plant just completed its second year of operation and is performing well within its permit limits.

Remediation work at the site of the former Elite Laundry has progressed quite well. The work has been funded by grants from the EPA, a supplemental grant through the NHDES Brownfields program, and TIFD funds. We have reached the point in the remediation process where the re-use of the site can now be actively considered. Over the next several months the Board of Selectmen, with the assistance of the EDC, will be actively working toward a reuse plan for the site.

We will be facing continuing challenges during the upcoming year. The Town will maintain its focus on providing the level and quality of services that our citizens have come to expect, in a cost effective manner. To that end, we have been successful in negotiating collective bargaining agreements that will result in a significant reduction in the cost of providing health care for our employees, and will continue to seek ways to keep the cost of providing services affordable.

The new rescue truck (16 Rescue 1) that was approved at the 2010 Town Meeting was delivered and put into service in July. The new 16 Rescue 1 was designed and built for the large amount of rescue tools and equipment that we have to be stored and carried on the truck allowing for safe operations

and timely deployment when they are needed during an emergency. With funds received from the Harold and Francis Turner Fund a new set of lifting air bags were purchased along with a new set of rescue jacks that were purchased with funds raised by the Jaffrey Firefighters Company Inc. (JFFCI). The new air bags replaced an old set of airbags that were past their useful life and the rescue jacks added to the existing compliment of rescue equipment. The new rescue equipment would not have been able to been purchased without the Turner funds or the funds raised by JFFCI.

We will continue to seek out grants and other ways of funding new and replacement equipment for the fire department. We have applied for Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) in 2011 and are in hopes that we will be awarded this grant for the purchase of much needed Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). If awarded this grant the Town will be responsible for 5% of the grant which is approximately \$12,000. We have submitted a warrant article for this year's Town Meeting to authorize the withdrawal of \$12,000 from the Fire & Rescue Equipment Capital Reserve Fund to be used as the 5% amount. In the event that the grant is not awarded the warrant article will ask that the \$12,000 be used to start replacing SCBA bottles. We ask you to support this warrant article. The rest of the fire department apparatus are in good condition and we will continue to maintain the vehicles so they remain in good condition and are ready to respond.

As of the end of the 2011 year we had 24 firefighters on the fire department. The firefighters trained on fire, rescue, EMS and specialty operations throughout the year and also maintained and check all of the equipment and apparatus on a weekly basis. The newer firefighters participated in trainings sponsored by the NH Fire Academy and six of the probationary firefighters will be attending Firefighter I certification class in the first part of 2012. Daytime hours still continue to be the time of day with limited availability of firefighters as a large majority of our firefighters are not available due to their fulltime jobs. Anyone that is interested in becoming a call firefighter should contact the Fire Chief at the fire station 532-8377 or go to the fire departments website www.jaffreyfire.org for information on joining the fire department.

Smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors need to be installed on every level of your home and additional smoke detectors should be installed

in every bedroom and hallway outside of the bedrooms. In addition to the hard wired smoke detectors that are already required in all residential rental properties all residential rental properties will require the installation of hard wired carbon monoxide detectors by July 1, 2013. The department experienced an increase of almost 20% in new (unduplicated) requests for assistance and an increase of almost 10% in expenditures over 2010. Increases are expected to continue due to significant budget cuts on the federal and state levels - and the department will continue to absorb the increases until the economy recovers. Other human services agencies this department depends on for assistance have also had their budgets cut. A failure to expand employment opportunities and extend unemployment benefits has steadily increased the need for rent, mortgage, electricity, and medication assistance over the past several years. Homeless shelters were at full capacity for most of the year statewide, requiring residents to be placed in hotels and motels.

New Hampshire will not see a return to its previous designs of spending, which makes it imperative for residents to be creative in planning for the future. Developers could explore building sustainable workforce housing enabling applicants to terminate state and local welfare assistance. Jaffrey could also benefit from a service exchange program in which members of the community offer a set of skills or services in exchange for needed services – at no cost. With a little change in perspective, this time can serve as a perfect opportunity for people to explore options for alternative ways to survive during the recession

Police Department



With the hiring of Officer Radford in August of 2011 our department, for the first time in quite some time, is fully staffed. Officer Radford has come to us as a NH certified officer with a considerable amount of training and experience in law enforcement. Jaffrey has benefited from this condition not only from the range and depth of Officer Radford's training but also in a significant savings realized by not having to send a new officer through Police Academy training.

In years past officers of our department have worked hard to compensate for staff shortages by demonstrating a willingness to flex work hours and perform a broad range of tasks in order to provide a professional level of law enforcement services. If, as I hope to be the case, we are fortunate enough to maintain this group of officers and civilian staff, we will be able to return some of our focus to areas of investigation and administration that have lacked attention when resources were more limited.

The partnership between our department and the Jaffrey-Rindge School District remains strong and productive. We are currently in the second year of the School Resource Officer program and I grow more convinced each day that the District's investment in this program has had a significant positive impact on creating a safer and more secure environment in our schools.

Economic hardship brings with it stresses and strife that often result in angry, frustrated behaviors. Police intervention in domestic related issues continues to be one of the most frequent and demanding type of call for service that we have to manage. It remains the goal and commitment of this department to help the families of Jaffrey deal with these unfortunate circumstances in a way that enables them to cope with these challenging times.

Cemeteries/Parks and Commons Division: In 2011, the Town performed 9 full-body and 7 cremation burials. The staff assisted and participated with the Cemetery Committee by attending regular meetings, work sessions and the annual cleanup. Staff also assisted the Committee with continuing work on the Cutter Cemetery expansion. Annual cemetery cleanup day was performed in November which removed materials from gravesites in preparation for winter and those that do not comply with the regulations to improve the general appearance of the facilities. The Town continued contracting out landscaping maintenance activities to a private contractor. Several unsightly shrubs located on lots in Conant Cemetery were removed and staff completed cleanup of storm related damage that had taken place over the past couple of years. As a result of the establishment of the Cemetery Trees Trust Fund, staff coordinated the removal of 6 old maple trees at the Old Burying Ground. And, finally, staff initiated a cemetery lot inventory program for Conant Cemetery (photo and lot records) through the invaluable assistance of Emily Preston. As a reminder to those who have loved ones buried in the cemeteries, artificial flowers are not permitted. These arrangements get entangled in the landscaping equipment and are a serious hazard to the workers.

Highway Division: In 2011, the Highway Department reconstructed 1,775 feet of Harkness Road westerly from the intersection of Proctor Road and overlayed Grove Street. Drainage cross culverts were replaced on Harkness Road, Jacquith Road and Parker Road. Highway Crews performed winter and summer (seasonal) maintenance on over 64 miles of Town roads (including 20 miles of gravel road) and assisted other Departments throughout the year including the Water, Sewer, Recreation, Fire and Police.

Engineering plans, specifications and bid documents were prepared for culvert rehabilitation at the Gilmore Pond Road bridge as a result of deficiencies cited by NHDOT and inclusion on the state's municipal "red list". Following receipt of competitive bids, the project was awarded to Van Dyke Construction and is expected to be completed this winter.

The Mechanic with assistance from Highway staff maintained and kept operational the Town's vehicles and in addition to maintaining highway vehicles, over 230 hours of labor was expended maintaining Fire, Police, Water, Sewer, and Recreation Department vehicles and equipment.



Wastewater Division: In 2011, the wastewater treatment plant processed approximately 212,455,000 gallons (average 582,068 gallons per day) of wastewater from 825 connections. United Water of Auburn, NH is in the seventh year of contract operations of the sewer facilities including the wastewater treatment plant, Hadley Road head works, 5 pump stations and 15 miles of collection sewer. As part of their normal operations, United Water completed cleaning of approximately 15,000 linear feet of collection sewer and repaired 46 manholes during the year. The sewer cleaning program is part of a preventive maintenance program begun in 2004 addressing the sanitary sewer collection system, manholes and pump stations. During 2011, there were 27 callouts for sewer related problems (blockages or overflows).

The Town completed the second full year of operation of the advanced wastewater treatment plant built to comply with an EPA Administrative Order to meet more stringent effluent standards. The town also completed construction of a wastewater filtration process and installed two pellet boilers funded in part through a 50% grant from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) also known as stimulus funds. The filtration system was completed and initiated operation last summer and the pellet boiler portion of the project came on-line last winter.

Total septage waste received at the new wastewater plant during 2011 was 1,220,233 gallons (equivalent to about 1,200 - 1,000 gallon septic tanks).

The Town also continued work on the system-wide infiltration/inflow program with particular attention to the area served by the Cross Street Pump Station. Examined were potential areas of infiltration (ground water entering the system through leaks in manholes and sewer mains) and inflow (non-sewage related drainage and sump pumps from private properties). DPW and wastewater staff and a consultant updated collection system documents and older planning documents and completed extensive field work including video inspection, flow isolation and inspection of manhole in the study area.

The Town was advised by DES that replacement of the River Street and Nelson Circle sewer pump stations are eligible for funding (40%) from the State of New Hampshire CWSRF to supplement local funds that had been previously appropriated. Engineering design is expected to begin this year.

Water Division: In 2011, the Department produced 115,530,150 gallons (average 316,521 gallons per day) from three groundwater wells at the Contoocook and Turnpike well houses and provided potable drinking water and fire protection to approximately 1,501 accounts in Jaffrey and Rindge. The Department responded to three (3) water main breaks and nine (9) service breaks. Hydrant maintenance continued with the replacement of 1 hydrant, and maintenance of 12 hydrants. Hydrants were flushed twice during the year (spring and fall). One (1) new meter was installed, sixtyeight (68) meters were replaced, and seventy-five (75) water meters were reprogrammed.

As reported last year the town contracted with Wachs, Inc. to complete a leak detection survey of the entire water distribution system. Report findings allowed the town to locate potential system water leaks and make the appropriate repairs.

Initiated Cross Connection and Backflow Testing Program with town staff and a contractor to complete mandatory semi-annual testing of all ninetytwo backflow prevention devices in town.

In 2011, Park Construction completed final paving on affected areas of Cathedral and Prescott Roads following the 2010 project that upgraded



the existing water transmission line from Bullet Tank and existing water mains on Cathedral and Prescott Roads. Water main installation across Squantum Village Dam was not completed as removal of the spillway by the DES Dam Bureau was never resolved.

Prepared and initiated Bullet Pond Forest Management Plan. Selective cutting is scheduled to occur during 2012. This work is intended to improve the overall health and vitality of the forest.

As reported last year, engineering design and specifications for extending water to Old Sharon Road (Stone Bridge TIFD) have been completed and the town is still actively pursuing project funding from Economic Development Administration.

As reported last year, engineering plans and specifications were completed for the Squantum Road Well project for construction of a well house and treatment consisting of disinfection, pH adjustment and corrosion control. The project was advertised in January and awarded to Weston & Sampson CMR and construction is in progress with completion anticipated in early



2012. This project is being funded in part by the DES DWSRF program with a 40% grant.

Engineering Division: In 2011, the engineering division provided assistance to all Department of Public Works functions as well as other town departments and committees as necessary including the Energy Committee and Joint Loss Management Control Committee. Special projects included the second phase of preparing GIS/GPS locating and mapping of the water and sewer system physical structures; infiltration/inflow study of the sewer system; leak detection study of the water distribution system; and, Conant Cemetery program.

As was the case last year, a good deal of time was spent coordinating operation of the new advanced wastewater treatment plant and overseeing construction and start-up of the wastewater filtration system. With an administrative order from EPA to evaluate our ability to comply with a more stringent aluminum effluent limit, collected system data and also evaluated ability of the treatment plant to comply with and without filtration. All indications are that the treatment plant will comply with the new aluminum limit year round.

Oversaw Squantum Road Well final design plans and specifications and bidding and construction administration following in early 2011 with plans to move ahead soon after with construction and the project was approved for a 40% grant from the DES DWSRF Program. Design engineering and specifications completed for extending water to Old Sharon Road as part of Stone Bridge TIFD and currently exploring grant funding opportunities.

The division continued to work with the DES Dam Bureau on dam inspections and updating of operations and maintenance and emergency operations plans. New gates were received for the work at the Main Street Dam (replacement of the gates and operators) and the town has contracted with Lydon Company to complete this work in 2012. Due to significant rain and high river flows the work was not able to be completed in 2011.

Support was provided to the Planning Board as needed by reviewing site and subdivision plans, inspecting development projects, preparing bond recommendations for projects incorporating public improvements and approving as-built plans.



Solid Waste/Transfer/Recycling Division: Material received and processed at the Transfer Station in 2011 included the following approximate amounts: 899 tons compactor waste, 639 tons bulky waste including construction and demolition debris, 190 tons recycled material (plastics, paper, corrugated), and 29 tons light iron, 283 televisions, 96 computer monitors, 10 VCR's, 7 DVD players and 59 microwaves, 2 trailer loads of tires, 28 propane tanks, 109 batteries, and 109 Freon containing items. Aluminum was processed and baled but not sold during the year.

The Department continues to address operational and environmental recommendations presented by the Board of Selectmen's citizen advisory committee in 2004. Plans to cover and improve the bulky waste drop off area and replace and insulate the transfer station roof are incorporated in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan. Recent annual reports from DES indicated that Jaffrey's recycling rate continues to exceed the statewide average. The town continues to participate in a regional Household Hazardous Waste disposal program offered in Keene with collections held during summer and fall. The town in cooperation with DES, EPA and DEA has sponsored prescription drug take-back days at the Jaffrey Police Department as well as area police departments in accordance with a national program to promote safe drug disposal and keeping discarded drugs from solid waste and wastewater.

The staff continues to check for valid "dump" stickers and remind all that stickers can be obtained at both the Town Clerk's office and at the Transfer Station with a proof of residency. Seasonal stickers can be obtained at the DPW office.

We continue to process commodities through the NRRA, which competitively bids commodities and insures the best prices for their members. Throughout this year, we have seen the prices received for recyclables remain dismal. We are attempting to stockpile some recyclables until the market improves as we are able to receive more favorable pricing if full loads of the same commodity are sent to the vendor. Estimated revenue received from the sale of these commodities totaled \$ 24,924 in 2011. By actively recycling, the town saved over \$18,000 by not disposing of recyclable items along with household trash. Recreation Department



In 2011, the department continued efforts to provide facilities and programs while being ever conscious of our limited monetary resources. Partnerships were formed, staff was creative, and programs were added or changed to enhance offerings.

As an update to the Humiston Field expansion, the fence has been removed so the field may be expanded starting with the 2012 season. Work continues on the remaining structure so it may be utilized for storage. Landscape work continues around the building and in the area between the office and expanded field.

On a program note, the Summer Adventure Program was revamped to include youth from the 5th – 8th grade. The program was a big success, with 58 participants! An instructor was hired for the Summer Swim Program at Contoocook Beach and 45 swimmers took to the water for lessons. Two trips returned in 2011, with the Big "E" trip and the Bright Night trip filled to capacity. Two trips to the Boston Red Sox games were also offered during the spring and summer. A Flashlight Easter Hunt was added at Humiston Field for older children and the department partnered with Conant High School to offer a Field Hockey Camp in the summer. The department is also sponsoring two basketball teams made up of 3rd – 5th graders that is playing in the Suburban Traveling Basketball League.

Summer is always a busy time and the department was fortunate to work with the Conval School District in offering a free breakfast and lunch to our summer program participants. An unbelievable 1,359 meals were served throughout the summer at no cost to our program!

Existing programs continue to be popular and with excellent weather this summer, our outdoor recreation areas were well utilized.

One of the 2012 initiatives is the formation of a Recreation Committee. This committee would advise, recommend, promote and assist in offering public recreation programs. The Committee would act as a link between the Jaffrey Parks and Recreation Department and the Community.

Regional Prosecutor



2011 represents the first full year that the Prosecutor's office has served the Town of Jaffrey exclusively without a partnership with any other community. With operational hours reduced as they were in mid 2010 and with the police department maintaining a consistent number of arrests with 2010, we continue to be a leader in the number of cases submitted to the local court for prosecution. Our legal assistant, Michelle Szalanski, who took over late in 2010 has instituted a number of measures that have contributed to an improved and more efficient office operation. A statewide restructuring in the court system changing it from a district court system to a circuit court system had no serious impact on us but did require some readapting on our behalf. The former Jaffrey-Peterborough District Court is now the New Hampshire Circuit Court, 8th Circuit, Jaffrey District Division. Dramatic changes in the Juvenile Laws have also contributed to a somewhat smaller case load but not necessarily a reduction in the amount of incidents.

We continued to work with students from the Con-Val High School internship program and also periodically hosted observational sessions for students from Conant High School.

Suspended driver's licenses, domestic issues and drug and alcohol related offenses continue to be the most prevalent types of cases that we prosecute.

In all areas of offenses we have had \$21,671.64 in restitution ordered to be paid to victims through the Court, Department of Corrections or through our office. Additionally, in most cases where a defendant fails to appear and officers appear at court, witness fees are generally assessed and paid to the town's general fund.

Our office also receives a limited amount of revenue through the collection of discovery fees. In 2011 we received \$ 975.00.


