B. Public Hearings – 6:00pm Traffic Device Changes- The resolution was read by Chairman Moore. This resolution changes the Yield signs to Stop signs at Ellison and Stratton and Ellison and Route 124, as well as a Stop sign at Great Road and Fitzwilliam.

<u>Public Comments</u>: Carolyn Garretson commented that the "V" shaped intersection at Ellison and Rte. 124 is very difficult to see traffic because of the angle. If it were a 90 degree turn, visibility would be improved. Harry Young also commented that the "V" shaped intersection at Goodnow and North is another hard intersection to navigate. Paula Geraghty also mentioned the intersection of Great and Fitzwilliam should have a "Dangerous Intersection" sign posted because of the angle of that turn. Town Manager Frederick will share these concerns with DPW.

H. Reports to the Select Board

Selectmen's Reports

Sterling-

- 1. Budget Committee season will be starting up tomorrow night. He feels the Town Manager has good direction for the new Budcom members.
- 2. Transportation Advisory Committee- as the Jaffrey Rep. he attended a presentation about free transportation for Jaffrey residents. Rides to medical appointments appear to be the main reason for rides. There is a new town by town directory that should be given to the Welfare Coordinator.
- 3. <u>House Bill 2017-HB399-</u> This House Bill refers to Pesticides where children play. It was found that Organic pesticides are more likely to cause illness than synthetic pesticides.
- 4. <u>House Bill 1598</u>- This bill is regarding the withdrawing from cooperative school districts. It was just introduced on 1/3/18. The status of the bill can be followed on line by looking at the New Hampshire General Court webpage and clicking on bill status.

Moore

1. Petitioners asking for funding from the Town should be present at the Budcom meeting and well as Town Meeting. Last year the BOS Chairman had to speak for articles since the petitioners didn't attend Town Meeting.

Town Manager's Report

- 1. <u>Town Report</u> Cost of spiral bound is more expensive. TM would like BOS input. The size would remain the same at 8.5 x 11. The Board consented to proceed with perfect bound instead of spiral.
- 2. <u>Linden Street</u>- TM is asking the BOS for permission to re-start auction procedure. BOS granted him permission.
- 3. The list of Veteran Exemptions was reviewed. Sterling had mentioned that the State may pay out any additional Veteran exemption funds, this hasn't been finalized yet.
- 4. There will be a Martin Luther King Jr. presentation at the United Church of Jaffrey from 5-6pm followed by a reception Jaffrey Civic Center.
- 5. <u>Pre-Payment of Taxes-</u> The BOS can allow pre-payment of taxes for 2 years in advance, but it was suggested to speak with Finance and the Tax Collector, along with DRA to determine if an unrestricted fund would have to be established and if so, how funds would be then distributed.
- 6. School Apportionment- The School Board vote was 5-2 in favor of the addition to the ballot in March for the apportionment to be based on 100% of the average daily attendance. If approved, this would increase Jaffrey school taxes by 45 cents/year for 5 years. Jaffrey residents must voice their opinions at the deliberative session in February and get out to vote in March. Carolyn Garretson was concerned about the impact on Special education. Harry Young mentioned that on the surface the Rindge plan looks ok. Selectman Sterling explained that Rindge has a higher evaluation/assessment due to adding more taxable property to their taxes, making their apportionment amount higher than Jaffrey. Carolyn Garretson mentioned that attracting more tourist industry to Jaffrey would be helpful. TM Frederick commented that Jo Anne Carr (Planning & Economic Development) tries to get business into Jaffrey, but the tax rate is a deterrent.

Round Table Discussion

- 1. <u>Fertilizer</u> Chairman Moore wanted to know if the Budcom would be discussing the cost of the contract for this year and consider postponing treatment for a year.
- 2. <u>Petition Articles-</u> There was an article in the paper regarding Peterborough only having \$20,000 in petition article requests and Jaffrey has \$85,000 to \$90,000 in requests. Petitioners do go before the Budget Committee with their numbers of Jaffrey Residents that are served in the previous year. This is how they determine their request of need, which is a percentage of people served. Peterborough may have less people served, therefore a lower request for funds.
