Crayon Transfers

There is so much you can do with crayons! Follow the instructions below to make some really neat art with crayons. Use **Encyclopedia Britannica**, found through the library catalog, and look up "crayon" to learn how crayons are made.

Materials

- crayons
- two pieces of printer paper (or any white paper)
- pencil or pen

Step 1.

Color in one piece of paper with your crayons. Press hard (But not hard enough to break the crayon!) to make sure the crayon coats the paper.

Tip:

Use at least five colors, and don't worry about how it looks - this isn't the final piece of art.




Step 2.

Turn the colored side face down onto the other piece of paper and line them up - tape both pieces down if needed to hold them still.

Step 3.

Draw on the back with your pen or pencil and remember to press firmly - this will transfer the crayon onto the other paper!
