Kandinsky's Circle Project

Wassily (or Vasily) Kandinsky was a Russian painter who created some of the first abstract art. Materials

- a piece of square paper
- crayons
- paint brushes
- watercolor (pencils or paint)
- cup with water for the watercolors
- newspaper to cover work space



Step 1.

With help from a caretaker if needed, use a ruler to divide your paper into 9 squares.





Step 2.

In each square, start drawing circles of different sizes with your crayons. Leave white space between your circles.

Step 3.

Fill in the white spaces of your circles with watercolor. If you're using paint, remember to get it very wet, if you're using pencils, make sure to color in fully to get the most color!




Step 4.

Once the watercolors are dry, use a black marker or Sharpie to trace around your circles and lines.
