Application Guidelines: Any Jaffrey student may apply to the Jaffrey Board of Selectmen for post-secondary tuition assistance no later than July 1st of each year for the following school year.

Instructions: Applicants must complete the 2-part form provided by the Town of Jaffrey to show all financial information of the student and his or her immediate household. The Jaffrey Board of Selectmen will review all applications and rank order those who qualify for assistance using State of New Hampshire income guidelines to determine need. Applicants will be notified by mail of the decisions no later than August 30th of each year.
