

Arthur Lambert was a native of Jaffrey and was very proud of his community. After graduating from Conant High School in 1943 he served in the Asian-Pacific Theater with the US Army Air Corps during World War II. He was a gunner on B-24s and B-28s and flew many successful missions with the “Flying Tigers”. He retired from the 210<sup>th</sup> Engineer Detachment in Peterborough in 1984.

Arthur worked in the US Postal Service in Jaffrey for over 30 years. He was a member and Past Commander of the John Humiston Post #11 American Legion and Jaffrey VFW Post #5613. He was the master of the Jaffrey Grange #135 for the past three years and a member for over 35 years. Arthur was also a 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree member and past grand knight of the Knights of Columbus Council #8544 in Jaffrey and was on the first ambulance committee that founded the Jaffrey VFW Memorial Ambulance. He had been a member of the Jaffrey Fire Department for more than 20 years. Arthur was also a member of the Monadnock Rod and Gun Club and a lifetime member of the NRA.

He was the #1 Conant High School basketball fan. Arthur loved people and was always there to lend a helping hand. He was a volunteer driver for the Red Cross.

Business Meeting – March 13, 2004 (9:00 a.m.)**

**TO: The inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Ernest J. Pratt Auditorium in said Jaffrey on Tuesday, the 9th of March, 2004 at eight o'clock in the forenoon (polls close at 7:00 p.m.) to vote for the town officers and to act on other questions as required by law to be decided by official ballot. Pursuant to RSA 39:2a and the vote of the Town at the adjourned session of Town Meeting on March 13, 1979 and the Town Meeting on March 13, 1993, the business portion of the meeting will be recessed until nine o'clock in the forenoon, Saturday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2004, at which time the Town will act on all subjects described in the following Warrant Articles except those requiring action by official ballot:

**Art. 1. To choose the following Town Officers: (by Official Ballot)**

Moderator – one person for two-year term- Marc P. Tieger  
Supervisor of the Checklist – one person for six-year term – Betty Jane Balentine  
Selectman - one person for three-year term – Franklin W. Sterling, Jr.  
Trustee of Trust Funds - one person for three-year term – Edward Shea  
Library Trustee - two persons for three-year terms – Carolyn Jalbert and Elizabeth Shea

**Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendments to the Jaffrey Zoning Ordinance, as prepared by the Jaffrey Planning Board, to be voted on by Official Ballot: (The exact text, and related material, of each of these proposed changes is available at the Town Clerk's office and at the polling place.)**

1. Are you in favor of adoption of Amendment #1 to the Jaffrey Land Use Plan, as proposed by the Planning Board? The Amendment is as follows: "To revise and update Section XIV, Signs."

Yes - 1134

No – 573

2. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment #2 to the Land Use Plan as proposed by the Planning Board? The Amendment proposes to change line 7 of paragraph 15.13 describing the boundaries of the Industrial District (Northeast) which now reads "...thence southerly following the center line of Nutting Road and crossing Route 202 and continuing along the center line of Old Sharon Road to a point that is approximately 200 feet south of the intersection of the southerly end of the intersection of Coll's Farm Stand Road and Old Sharon Road..." The proposed change reads "...200 feet south of the intersection of the **northerly** end of Coll's Farm Stand Road and Old Sharon Road."

Yes - 1178

No – 535

***Recessed until March 13, 2004, 9:00 a.m.***

The meeting was called to order, and the attendants were asked to stand as the Boy Scouts from Mountain Troop 33 presented the colors and led the Pledge of Allegiance. After which Mr. Tieger asked everyone to remain standing as he read the following:

*"We come together again as is our tradition to help guide and decide the business of the Town for the coming year. We are citizens with different philosophies and options and yet we are united in our common purpose – the continuing commitment to the well being of this wonderful town, which we are so fortunate to call home.*

*We come with heavy hearts and confused minds, as we observe world events. For some of us this anxiety is intensified as our sons and daughters, husbands and wives, and those of our friends are called to the service of their country. Please know that our thoughts and prayers are with them, and with you, in these most difficult times. We also respect and understand the rights of those with differing opinions and we sympathize with them in their anguish. Above all we are reminded again of how fortunate we are to live in the United State of America where the rights of all are respected.*

*As we reflect on the losses our community has endured during the past year we re-affirm in silence our gratitude to those men and women of what has been rightfully called the Greatest Generation for their lack of selfishness, their commitment to their nation. Our freedom is the result of them and their sacrifices.*

*So let us listen and question, let us speak and debate with civility and respect, let us learn from others even as we put forth our own views, and when the meeting is over let us leave with the knowledge that the tradition of our Jaffrey Town Meeting, and our role of participation in it, remains strong. Please join me in a few moments of silent meditation and reflection.”*

Mr. Tieger then welcomed everyone to the meeting and went over some general announcements.

Mr. Tieger then asked all those who were on various Boards, Committees and departments for the Town to stand in order to be recognized for their service.

Mr. Tieger introduced the front tables where the Selectmen, Town Manager, Department Heads, Town Clerk and Budget Committee Chairman sat.

Mr. Tieger went over the ground rules for the meeting. He introduced microphone handlers and the assistant moderator, Philip Cournoyer.

Mr. Tieger proposed to waive reading of the Warrant in its entirety. It was so moved and seconded.

Mr. Tieger then read the results from Tuesday's election.

**Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed, Six Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$6,800,000) for the purpose of establishing a new water source for the town to include acquisition of land, if necessary, the installation of water mains to connect the new source to the water system, to construct any related treatment facilities for the new water source, to conduct studies and rehabilitation on the two existing wells, and to install a new water main on River Street. The said sum is to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1, et seq., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and any other vote relative thereto. This bond is to be paid 2/3 by the water users and 1/3 from the general tax base. Also, it is proposed that the Stone Arch Bridge TIFD funds \$500,000 of this bond. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.**

## TOWN MEETING MINUTES

After the article was moved and seconded it was proposed to amend the article by Roy Stone. Mr. Stone wanted to change “establishing a new water source” to “re-establishing Bullet Pond as a third water source” and then taking “new” when used in conjunction with a water source. After some lengthy debate and discussion it was moved to vote on the amended article, it failed on a division vote of 58 – yes and 168- no.

The article was then moved and addressed by Selectman Frank Sterling. After some questions, explanations and comments the article was moved to vote.

Mr. Tieger instructed the voters that this was to be a ballot question, therefore ballot “A” was to be used and that the polls would be open for one hour. The results were as follows:

Yes – 147                      No – 112  
The article failed to get the 2/3 majority.

Selectman Frank Sterling was then recognized to speak. Mr. Sterling then read the following resolutions:

*Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 13, 2004, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting.”*

*“Whereas, Stanford Long has served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and distinction for four years as a member of the Zoning Board of Adjustment; and*

*Now, therefore be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 13, 2004, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting.”*

*“Whereas, Julia Bartlett has served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and distinction for one year as a member of the Planning Board;*

*Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 13, 2004, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting.”*

*“Whereas, Thomas Doane has served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and distinction for one year as a member of the Conservation Commission;*

*Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 13, 2004, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting.”*

*“Whereas, Kathy Eneguess has served the Town of Jaffrey with honor and*

*distinction for one year as a member of the Economic Development Council; Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed in Town Meeting convened March 13, 2004, that the Town of Jaffrey wishes to express our thanks and sincere gratitude and that this expression of our thanks be made a part of the official record of this meeting."*

There was a round of applause. Mr. Tieger moved to accept the proclamations by acclamation. So moved and seconded.

**Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) for the purpose of acquiring and renovating property to be used as a Jaffrey Community Center. The said sum is to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1, et seq., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and any other vote relative thereto. This bond is proposed to be paid in its entirety by the Downtown Tax Increment Finance District. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.**

So moved and seconded. Selectman Clay Hollister addressed the article.

After some questions, comments and ideas on how to raise future monies the article was moved to vote. Mr. Tieger explained that the article was a ballot vote and that ballot "B" was to be used, the polls were declared open and after a sufficient amount of time the results of the vote were as follows:

Yes – 203

No – 34

The article passed by more than the required 2/3.

John Field moved to go to Article 27. So moved and seconded.

**Art. 27. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:27-a, (and RSA 72:28) for the optional increase of veteran's property tax credit from \$51 to \$500 and the optional tax credit for service connected total disability in an amount**

**from \$701 to \$2,000 and replace the standard tax credit in its entirety?  
Submitted by Petition.**

It was moved by Robert Chamberlain and seconded by Dick Grodin to amend the article to read as follows:

*“Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:27-a, (and RSA 72:28) for the optional increase of veteran’s property tax credit from \$51 to \$500 and the optional tax credit for service connected total disability in an amount from \$701 to \$2,000; and subsequently to increase the present veteran’s property tax credit from \$100 to \$200 and increase the present service-connected disability from \$1,400 to \$1,800?”*

After some questions and discussion it was moved to vote on the amendment.

The amendment was passed by voice vote.

It was then moved to vote on the article as amended, and the vote was requested to be by secret ballot. Mr. Tieger instructed the voters to use ballot “C”, the polls were then opened to a sufficient amount of time. The results were as follows:

Yes – 143      No – 56

The article passed.

**Art. 5. That all reports submitted by Town Officers be accepted as read and as printed in the Town Report.**

So moved and seconded.

A few errors in the town report were brought up. The article was then moved to a vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

**Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Police union, AFSCME local 3657 that calls for the following increases in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 10. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

So moved and seconded. Selectman Michael Barlick addressed the article. With no discussion or questions the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

**Art. 7. Shall Jaffrey, if Article 6 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 6 cost items only?**

This article was passed over.

**Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Public Works union, AFSCME local 2973 that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 10. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

2004	\$26,867

So moved and seconded. Selectman Michael Barlick addressed the article.

With no discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

**Art. 9. Shall Jaffrey, if Article 8 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 8 cost items only?**

**TOWN OF JAFFREY**  
**TRANSFER STATION/RECYCLING ORDINANCE**

**Article I**  
**TITLE**

*This ordinance is entitled and may be referred to as the "Transfer Station/Recycling Ordinance of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire."*

**Article II**  
**PURPOSE & AUTHORITY**

*The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the regulations necessary for the disposal of waste and recyclables by the residents of Jaffrey. This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to and consistent with NH RSA 31:39 and RSA 149-M:17.*

**Article III**  
**DEFINITIONS**

*For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:*

- A. Commercial Enterprise: Any sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation which conducts any type of business operation, profit or non-profit.*
- B. Household Refuse: means and includes any waste product, solid or having the character of a solid rather than a liquid in that it will not flow readily without additional liquid, and which is composed wholly or partly of such materials as garbage, sweepings, cleanings, trash, rubbish, litter.*
- C. Person: any individual, association, partnership, or corporation, and including any officer or employee of any association, partnership or corporation.*
- D. Resident: any individual person who makes residency in Jaffrey by actions such as, but not limited to, owning and living in a home, renting and living*

*in an apartment or other rental unit, registering any automobiles, or registering to vote in Jaffrey.*

- E. Non-resident property owner: Any individual person who owns a home in Jaffrey and lives in that home for at least 30 days out of any year.*

**Article IV**

**USE OF FACILITY**

*The use of the Transfer Station/Recycling Center shall be restricted to residents of Jaffrey and non-resident property owners, proof of which must be provided at the time*

*of application for a permit. Further, the use of the facility is restricted to waste generated from their residential properties in Jaffrey. Any commercial enterprise shall not be issued a permit for use of the facility, except for the specific purpose of depositing recyclables.*

**Article V**

**ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR USE OF THE FACILITY**

*Permits shall be issued from the Town Clerk's Office subject to the following restrictions:*

- A. Permits shall be issued on an annual basis. The amount of permits issued to a household shall not exceed the number of vehicles registered to that household address.*
- B. Permits shall be inscribed with the license plate number for the vehicle to which it shall be affixed.*
- C. Permits shall be affixed to the passenger side window or right front bumper of a vehicle.*
- D. Permits shall not be transferred from one vehicle to another.*
- E. Permits shall be effective from June 1<sup>st</sup> through May 31<sup>st</sup> of each year.*
- F. If a vehicle is sold, the owner may remove the permit to the extent possible, and along with evidence of the vehicle sale, return it to the Town Clerk's Office for the issuance of a new permit for a replacement vehicle at no charge for the balance of the effective year.*

**Article VI**

**ACCEPTABLE WASTES**

*The following constitutes acceptable wastes to be disposed at the Transfer Station/Recycling Center:*

**TOWN MEETING MINUTES**

- A. Household refuse;
- B. *Recyclables, all of which shall be separated from all other waste and shall be deposited in the marked containers within the Recycling Center, and which include but are not limited to: cardboard, newspaper, magazines, glass, aluminum cans, plastic jugs, plastic bottles;*
- C. Construction and demolition waste;
- D. Motor vehicle waste oil, tires and batteries;
- E. Brush less than 5" in diameter;
- F. Scrap metal including appliances.

*The Selectmen may impose fees for the disposal of the items listed above to recover costs incurred by the Town. The Selectmen, may upon good cause shown, allow exceptions for the use of the facility for civic groups or other similar organizations which may be providing a public benefit such as a road-side or community clean-up day.*

**Article VII  
UNACCEPTABLE WASTE**

*The following waste items shall not be accepted at the Transfer Station/Recycling Facility:*

- A. *Harmful, hazardous, or toxic substances except when the Town may provide a "Hazardous Waste Collection Day";*
- C. *Medical or veterinary waste;*
- D. *Sludge or septic waste;*
- E. *Any material the Board of Selectmen or its agents may deem to be harmful or hazardous to the public or facility.*

**Article VIII  
MISCELLANEOUS**

*It shall be unlawful to conduct any of the activities listed below on the Transfer Station/Recycling Center property or on the capped landfill abutting the Transfer Station/Recycling Center:*

- A. *Hunting;*

- B. *Discharge of any type of firearm except by authorized town personnel;*
- C. *Operation of any Off-Highway Recreational Vehicle;*
- D. *Operation of any motor vehicle except on the roadway in and out of the Transfer Station/Recycling Center and the areas immediately adjacent to the Center in order to dispose of waste;*
- E. *Dump-picking, except when provided verbal permission from a Transfer Station Attendant. The Town assumes no liability for any person who chooses to dump-pick with or without the express permission from an Attendant.*

**Article IX  
VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES**

1. *Any person, firm or corporation who violates any provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a violation for each offense and shall be subject to a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each offense.*
2. *Any person, firm or corporation who violates any provisions of the Ordinance three or more times in a twelve-month period shall be fined five hundred dollars (\$500) for each violation beyond three in a twelve-month period.*

**Article X  
SEVERABILITY**

*If any provisions of this Ordinance or the application of such provisions to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance and applicability of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.*

**Article XI  
EFFECTIVE DATE**

*This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on March 13, 2004 following its enactment by the 2004 Town Meeting.*

*So moved and seconded. Selectman Clay Hollister and Dick Grodin addressed the article.*

*Selectman Frank Sterling proposed to amend the last line under Article IV to read as follows "The Selectmen may impose fees for the disposal of the items listed above to recover the cost incurred by the Town with exception of items A&B in Article IV." So moved and seconded. After a brief discussion on the amendment it was moved to vote.*

*The amendment passed by voice vote.*

*The moderator then announced that there were some scribers changes to this ordinance (as see above, indicated by strikeouts and the new wording in italics).*



Pursuant to RSA 39:2a and the vote of the Town at the adjourned session of Town Meeting on March 13, 1979 and the Town Meeting on March 13, 1993, the business portion of the meeting will be recessed until nine o'clock in the forenoon, Saturday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2005, at which time the Town will act on all subjects described in the following Warrant Articles except those requiring action by official ballot:

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: Several recent NH Supreme Court decisions have changed the criteria for a variance. This amendment brings us into compliance with those decisions.**

**Art. 3.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed, Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000) for the purpose of establishing a new water source for the town to include acquisition of land, if necessary, the installation of water mains to connect the new source to the water system, to construct any related treatment facilities for the new water source, and to conduct studies and rehabilitation on the two existing wells, and any other costs related thereto. The said sum is to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1, et seq., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and any other vote relative thereto. This bond is to be paid 2/3 by the water users and 1/3 from the general tax base. The Stone Arch Bridge Tax Increment Finance District (TIFD) will fund \$500,000 of this bond if the water mains are routed through this TIFD. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** Last year we brought forward a warrant article for a new water source. The Town turned it down by a narrow margin. As a result of that vote, we formed a committee of residents to help us review the options available to us. This committee met frequently and provided us with a number of good recommendations. From the committee's list of recommendations, and with what we feel is available to the Town for viable water sources, we believe there are two options. The first option is obtaining groundwater from the Annett State Forest, which is owned by the State of NH. We are currently conducting tests in that area to see if water is available to meet our needs. The second option is to obtain water from the Bass family site located on the Jaffrey/Sharon town line. The Bass family has conducted a number of tests to determine water quality and quantity. We await their test results to determine if this is a viable source. We don't have enough information on either source at this time to determine which would be best for the Town. If both of these sources prove to be viable then we will conduct a cost-benefit analysis to determine which is the best deal for the Town. If only one of the sources proves viable then we will pursue that one. If neither source proves viable, then we go back to the drawing board. Although we don't have as much information as we would like to present to you to make this decision, we are also faced with a dilemma on our funding of this project. If we get bonding approval from the Town at the 2005 Town Meeting, we can secure a grant from the State of NH which would provide a loan for this project at approximately 0.5% below market rates on our borrowing costs. If \$6 million were to be bonded for this project, 0.5% on a 20-year bond, equates to an annual savings of approximately \$25,000. We feel it is incumbent upon us to provide the voters the opportunity to secure this more favorable funding which might not be available next year, even without precise information on where we would obtain the additional water source. Also, included in this bond is money to conduct further studies and rehabilitation on the two existing wells.

**Art. 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed, Nine Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$950,000) for the purpose of final design of the upgrade to the wastewater treatment facility, and any other costs related thereto. The said sum is to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1, et seq., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes to determine the rate of interest

thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and any other vote relative thereto. This bond is to be paid 2/3 by the sewer users and 1/3 from the general tax base. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The other major project that the Town faces is the upgrade to the Wastewater Facility. This has been a very long, on-going project that is finally coming to fruition. In 1995 we first received an order from the State of NH to upgrade our treatment process. We fought long and hard to delay this project until we found the most suitable treatment process at the best price for the Town. We fought so long and hard that the State eventually gave up on us and passed this problem on to the EPA. We now have an EPA order which faces us. We have looked at everything possible and now we must design the final process in order to meet the EPA's order. After design funding obviously comes construction funding. That vote will be put forward to you in 2006. We do not relish putting forward these articles any more than you relish voting on them. However, we have no choice but to upgrade our system to meet today's wastewater treatment requirements.

**Art. 5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed, Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$850,000) for the purpose of installing a new water main along River Street from the intersection of River and Main Streets to the intersection of River Street and Lacy Road, and any other costs related thereto. The said sum is to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:1, et seq., as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may become available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to this project; to authorize the Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and any other vote relative thereto. This bond is to be paid 2/3 by the water users and 1/3 from the general tax base. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee. 2/3 Ballot Vote Required.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The water main running down River Street needs to be replaced. It serves all the neighborhoods on River Street, Gilmore Pond Road, Lacy Road and Tyler Hill Road. The main is undersized and is clogged with material that doesn't allow these neighborhoods to have the proper water pressure they should have and further, due to low

water pressure at least 7 fire hydrants are now unable to be used. The new main will provide better service to these residents, better fire protection for all neighborhoods and will better contain any leakage that currently exists in this main.

Art. 6. That all reports submitted by Town Officers be accepted as read and as printed in the Town Report.

**LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: The purpose of this article is simply to accept all reports as printed in the Town Report, and to take the opportunity to discuss them if anyone has a question.**

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Police union, AFSCME local 3657 that calls for the following increases in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 11. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This article allows for the continuation of the contract as agreed to by the Town and the Police Union, and the payment of the cost items included therein.**

Art. 8. Shall Jaffrey, if Article 7 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 7 cost items only?

**LAYMAN’S LANGUAGE: This article is a requirement to allow the Town to delegate the authority to the Selectmen to call one special town meeting to reconsider Article 6 should it fail. If Article 6 passes, then this article is passed over.**

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Town and the Public Works union, AFSCME local 2973 that calls for the following increase in salaries and benefits, this amount is included in Article 11. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** This article allows for the continuation of the contract as agreed to by the Town and the Public Works Union, and the payment of the cost items included therein.

**Art. 10.** Shall Jaffrey, if Article 9 is defeated, authorize the governing body to call one special meeting, at its option, to address Article 9 cost items only?

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** This article is a requirement to allow the Town to delegate the authority to the Selectmen to call one special town meeting to reconsider Article 8 should it fail. If Article 8 passes, then this article is passed over.

**Art. 11.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,923,316 for general municipal operations. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** This is the article which provides the funds necessary to operate the Town on an annual basis. This includes all salaries, maintenance, supplies and programs which are funded and operated by the Town.

**Art. 12.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120,000 to purchase a new dump truck for the Department of Public Works. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** This article would provide funds to replace a 1991 10-wheel dump truck for the DPW. The current truck has some serious rusting on its chassis which cannot be repaired. The new vehicle will allow the Town to better maintain our roads and will help out with water and sewer system repairs.

**Art. 13.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a five-year lease agreement for \$190,000 for the purpose of leasing a new or refurbished fire engine for the Fire Department.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The Town has two fire engines. Our Engine 2 has developed a rust problem on its chassis (similar to that on the 1991

dump truck above) which is unable to be repaired and has caused us to pull the current Engine 2 off the road. The Town of New Ipswich has kindly loaned us one of their engines to fill in our need for a second engine. This article will allow the Town to either refurbish this engine or replace it with a new engine. We have proposed it as a lease to delay the cost impact until 2006 as we have a major cost in 2005 with the dump truck. This article authorizes the Selectmen to enter into a lease. We are not asking for any funds to be paid on the lease in 2005. As stated, we plan to present the cost for this vehicle in 2006. The lease agreement will allow us to take possession of a new truck in 2005.

**Art. 14.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a three-year lease agreement for \$28,158 for the purpose of leasing a command vehicle for the Fire Department, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,479 for the second year's payment for that purpose. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** In 2005, we were able to secure a grant from the Department of Homeland Security for Fire Department related expenses. We had a need for a command vehicle for the Fire Department to allow our fire officers to respond to calls in an emergency vehicle equipped with items necessary on a fire scene. Previously, these fire officers responded in their own vehicles and did not always have the capacity for necessary equipment. The Selectmen approved entering a lease after last year's Town Meeting which is allowed by law. However, at the next available Town meeting the Selectmen must bring forward an article which authorizes the execution of the lease. This is that article.

**Art. 15.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500, and to deposit said sum into the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund established in 2000. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** This fund was started in 2000, and currently has approximately \$2,916 in it. The purpose of this fund is to repair any damaged gravestones to the extent possible.

**Art. 16.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 and to deposit said sum into the Town Clock Trust Fund established in 1998. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The clock in the Woman's Club building needs a major overhaul, estimated to cost \$20,000. There is approximately \$16,173 in the fund now. We hope to start the overhaul in 2005.

**Art. 17.** To see if the Town will vote to amend the exemption amounts for elderly, disabled and blind exemptions to the following amounts to be effective April 1, 2005, and changing the income limit for the married disabled exemption to \$25,000 and the total assets for the disabled exemption to \$50,000:

Elderly (Ages 65 to 70)	\$20,000	\$40,000
Elderly (Ages 70 to 80)	\$30,000	\$60,000

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** Due to the soon-to-be released values from our current revaluation, we are proposing an adjustment to the above exemptions. As it is very likely that most assessments on properties in Town will double when the new values are released, without amendment the exemptions which are in place would be halved in terms of their effectiveness for those who are eligible to receive the exemption. For example, if a house is currently assessed at \$100,000 and receives a \$30,000 exemption, the homeowner is liable for the remaining \$70,000 in assessment, or 70% of the assessment. If, after the new values are released, the same house is assessed at \$200,000, and we did not change the exemptions, the homeowner would still receive only a \$30,000 exemption, thus making the homeowner liable for \$170,000 of assessment on their property, or 85% of the assessment. With a change to the exemption from \$30,000 to \$60,000, the same homeowner, under the new values would have their assessment reduced from \$200,000 to \$140,000, making them liable for \$140,000 on their assessment, or the same 70% for which they are liable under the current values.

**Art. 18.** To see if the Town will vote to accept the revised Stone Arch Bridge Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** In an effort to keep the Town apprised of the activities of the two TIFDs, we are placing the financing plans on the warrant every year. The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD, located mostly along Route 202 from DD Beans and along Old Sharon Road, currently funds the new bridge which was built 2 years ago. If article 3 above passes and if the

new water source is located at the Bass property off Old Sharon Road, the connecting water mains would be routed through this TIFD and would provide a benefit to the TIFD, thus this TIFD would provide funding to help pay for the bond in article 3. This TIFD also funds administrative costs related to managing the TIFDs. Finally, a new sign for the Stone Arch Bridge Industrial Park is proposed to be paid from this TIFD.

**Art. 19.** To see if the Town will vote to accept the revised Downtown Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The Downtown TIFD covers all of the downtown area. It funds a contribution to TEAM Jaffrey to help support their efforts, and it also funds the bond payment on the purchase of the property in 2005 for a new community center. In 2006, we also hope to provide funds for an expansion of the new Rails to Trails running north behind the Monadnock Shopping Plaza.

**Art. 20.** To see if the Town will vote to create an expendable trust fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, to be known as the Downtown Street Sign Replacement Fund, for the purpose of replacing the decorative street signs in the downtown area. TEAM Jaffrey has donated the \$750 to be used as the initial deposit for this Trust Fund. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** You may have noticed the new decorative street signs in the downtown area. Those were purchased by TEAM Jaffrey as a result of one of their many downtown initiatives. They have generously donated \$750 to the Town to start a trust fund that will provide funds for these signs to be replaced when damaged. This article authorizes a trust fund to be established for that purpose.

**Art. 21.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,406 to support the Jaffrey-Rindge Memorial Ambulance for the ensuing year. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE:** The Jaffrey-Rindge Memorial Ambulance has submitted this article to the Town. The Selectmen and Budget Committee have met with the Board of Directors of the ambulance service and heartily support this petition.

**Art. 22.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the support of the Monadnock Community Early Learning Center, a non-profit agency, or take any other action relating thereto. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

**LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article which we receive annually and which provides a community benefit to the residents of Jaffrey and the Region.**

# **INDEFINITE DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY**



**INDEFINITE DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY BY THE TOWN  
TO THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN AND LIBRARY TRUSTEES**

Prior to 1999, a number of articles appeared on the Town Warrant each year delegating specific powers to the Board of Selectmen and the Library Trustees. These articles are usually referred to as “boilerplate articles.” During the 1999 annual meeting, Jaffrey’s citizens voted (Articles 32-38) to “authorize indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority” the Selectmen and the Library Trustees to undertake various actions and, therefore, to no longer include these articles on future Town Meeting Warrants. The Town of Jaffrey now has seven such warrant articles, which are listed below for your reference:

**1) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS**

Shall the Town accept the provisions of New Hampshire *Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 31:95-b*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to apply for, accept, and expend without further action by the Town Meeting, unanticipated money from federal, state, or other governmental agencies or a private source that becomes available during the year?

**2) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS BY LIBRARIES**

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH *RSA 202-A:4-c*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Library Trustees to apply for, accept, and expend without further action by the Town Meeting, unanticipated money from a federal, state, or other governmental unit or a private source that becomes available during the year?

**3) TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES**

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH *RSA 33:7*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes?

**4) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS, LEGACIES, AND DEVICES**

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH *RSA 31:19*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to accept on behalf of

the Town gifts, legacies, and devises made to the Town in trust for any public purpose, as permitted by this statute?

**5) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY**

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH *RSA 31:95-e*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property that may be offered to the Town for any public purpose? The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting such a gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the Town to raise, appropriate, or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of such equipment.

**6) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY BY LIBRARIES**

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH *RSA 202-A:4-d*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Library Trustees to accept gifts of personal property that may be offered to the Library for any purpose; provided, however, that no acceptance of personal property by the Library Trustees shall be deemed to bind the Town or the Library Trustees to raise, appropriate, or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of such personal property?

**7) TRANSFER OF TAX LIENS AND SALE OF TAX DEED PROPERTY**

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH *RSA 80:80*, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Deed by either conveying said property back to its original owner(s) for consideration equal to all associated unpaid property taxes, interest, and expenses, or to sell said property at public auction, or to otherwise dispose of property as justice may require?

**INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

To the Board of Selectmen  
Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 2003, as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the basic financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the basic financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall basic financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As more fully described in Note 1, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the financial statements of the General Fixed Asset Account Group, which should be included to conform with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Asset Account Group is not known.

As described in Note 1, the Town has recognized tax revenues of \$310,169 in its General Fund which were not be received in cash within sixty days of year end as required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GASB Interpretation 3). Town officials believe, and we concur, that the application of this accounting principle, which would result in a decrease in the General Fund balance from \$390,896 to \$80,727, would give a misleading impression of the Town's ability to meet its current and future obligations.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the general purpose financial statements of the omission described in the third paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to in the first paragraph present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire as of December 31, 2003, and the results of its operations for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

## AUDIT REPORT

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated April 2, 2004 on our consideration of the Town's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* and should be read in conjunction with this report in considering the results of our audit.

The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations*, and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. The combining financial statements listed as schedules in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.



**REPORT OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMAN**

The same issues that have dogged us for the last decade chased us into 2004, although this year we think we've actually made some progress towards a lasting resolution on two of the most pressing/vexing problems to face our community. We also have made a beginning in building our long-sought-after Community Center.

At the March 2004 Town Meeting, we had a lengthy discussion of a proposal that would have brought an additional water supply on line. The addition of that source would have brought the Town into compliance with the State's requirements that we have the capability to meet the average daily demand for water should our single largest source of water, for whatever reason, become unavailable. The Selectmen's request was that, although we had not been able as of Town Meeting to conclude all the final details of the contract to secure the water source, we were sure enough after ten years and over one million dollars in studies that the proposal was a good bargain for the Town. After much discussion and a narrow margin, the bond issue was defeated. However all was not lost in that during the discussion it had been proposed that a citizens' committee be formed to review several alternative options that had been raised. Therefore, shortly after Town Meeting, an *ad hoc* Water Committee was formed, and they set to work investigating alternative sources of drinking water. They made a number of recommendations, including the installation of redundant wells as a fail-safe to a failure of our existing wells. They also concluded that the Annette State Forest area had not been sufficiently researched for potential water sources. At the time that this report is being written and prepared for the Town's Annual Report, we have not been able to complete the testing necessary to make any determination as to the viability of this area. We will continue to test and, hopefully, by the 2005 Town Meeting, we will have some definitive answers for your consideration.

Of equally long duration has been the difficulty in obtaining a wastewater discharge permit for the Town's treated effluent. Thankfully, this saga appears to be reaching a successful conclusion. We have reached agreement with the State's Department of Environmental Services (DES) and the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on the standards that our effluent must meet before being discharged into the Contoocook River. Now that the limitations have been agreed upon, we can proceed to the design of a Wastewater Treatment plant that will treat the effluent to those specifications. Accordingly, there will be a warrant article requesting funding for the preliminary design of a new wastewater facility. We have specified to our engineers that, whatever process and design they propose, it be flexible enough to meet not only future volume demands but also

the ever-evolving standards and limits of DES and/or EPA. We will continue to look for additional sources of money to offset the cost of this big project and thus help reduce the burden on the rate and taxpayer.

On a very bright note, after we received authorization from Town Meeting, we moved very quickly to obtain the property at the end of Union Street upon which we have proposed to build a Community Center. Coupled with the bonding authority from Town Meeting and the generous donation from the Bean Family Foundation, the deal was closed early in the Spring. Immediately after we took possession, we commissioned a study of the buildings to determine their suitability for use as our planned Community Center. Our consultants determined that, because there were so many physical defects to the building, we would be better off demolishing them and building new. Acting on their recommendation, the buildings have been leveled and the site prepared for redevelopment. On an even stronger note, we have recently been advised that we have been awarded a grant of \$40,000 from the Land and Water Conservation Fund for the purpose of constructing a baseball/softball field on this site. We will plan and build that ballfield this year.

With our Town Manager, we continue to work hard at holding down the cost to run Jaffrey and still provide quality service. Our proposed budget for the Town for this coming year represents an increase of only 1.88 percent.

These are just some of the events that occurred in Jaffrey during 2004 with, perhaps, the biggest impact. Other events, such as T.E.A.M. Jaffrey's Scarecrows on the Common, Wednesday night Concerts at the Gazebo, and Winter Carnival on Main Street, along with the ever-spectacular Chamber of Commerce's Festival of Fireworks, continue to reflect the strong and wonderful community that Jaffrey is. We hope to be able to continue to foster the spirit and vitality of Jaffrey into and through 2005.

Thank you for allowing us to continue to serve you.

**REPORT OF THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE**

**THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE** was established in 1991 to advise the Town on the operation, maintenance and preservation of Jaffrey’s public cemeteries: Conant Cemetery, The Old Burying Ground, Cutter Cemetery, Phillips-Heil Cemetery and the Village (Baptist) Cemetery (inactive). It is composed of representatives of the local chapters of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Historical Society, Cournoyer Funeral Home, the Board of Selectmen and three appointed Members at Large. Town employees Randy Heglin, Rick Forcier and Peachie Chalke assist the Committee in its work.

During 2004 the Committee met nine times with Town staff to discuss operation, budget and maintenance issues. It also inspected all of Jaffrey’s cemeteries. Each cemetery is overseen by a member of the Committee. This oversight involves inspecting the cemetery from time to time and reporting on conditions and problems at Committee meetings.

John D. Field replaced Alan Cote as the representative of the American Legion and the V.F.W. The Committee thanks Alan for his service and welcomes John.

The Committee has completed its review of the Jaffrey’s *Cemetery Rules and Regulations* and at the start of 2005 has recommended significant changes to the Selectmen.

In the fall of 2004 the Kaufhold Family Memorials & Stone Works of Peterborough repaired a total of 50 gravestones in Conant and The Old Burying Ground. Repairs ranged from stone straightening to crack sealing, bracing and mortar work. The source of funds for this restoration work was the special trust fund that has been added to at recent Town Meetings. Stone straightening was also done by volunteers in the Old Burying Ground. Another major volunteer undertaking was the scraping



and painting of the cast iron fence at Cutter Cemetery.

The Committee's most ambitious undertaking in recent years has been its involvement in the expansion of Cutter Cemetery into an adjoining 1.5 acre open lot. The acquisition of the site was overwhelmingly approved at last year's Town Meeting, 69% of the \$79,000 cost being raised by individuals, organizations and commissions, the remainder by the Town. In the coming year a survey will be undertaken which will allow the commencement of lot sales.

The Committee looks forward in 2005 to 1) advising on the implementation of the revised *Cemetery Rules & Regulations* and developing a pamphlet summarizing them; 2) continuing the expansion and improvement of cemetery record keeping; 3) arranging and overseeing a restoration by volunteers of the fencing around John Conant's grave at the cemetery named for him; 4) establishing a new annual tradition by offering an Autumn cemetery tour; and 5) advising on the planning and development of the Cutter Extension.

THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION was established in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 36-A for the proper use and protection of Jaffrey's natural resources and watershed resources. The Commission provides a focal point within the town and Town government for environmental concerns. The Commission may advise the Planning Board and other local bodies on conservation matters. The Commission may act more directly to protect natural resources, by acquiring land, either outright or through easements, with the approval of the Selectmen. The Commission may then manage these conservation areas. The Commission also manages designated Town forests.

The year 2004 was another active year for Jaffrey's Conservation Commission as we continue our attempts to provide valuable services to the Town boards and residents of Jaffrey. Our activities this year include:

- Three members attended the annual Saving Special Places conference in April where they strengthened their knowledge on the values of natural resources and tools to help conserve and manage natural resources, such as water resources (drinking water/lakes/ponds/wetlands), open space/vistas, and implications to tax base and quality of life.
- In collaboration with Town Economic Development Director, submitted grant application to SPACE for a Cost of Community Services (COCS) grant, which the Commission hopes to undertake in 2005.
- Continued to conduct a Natural Resource Inventory of town to aide in efforts to identify critical areas in need of protection using evolving land use criteria. This includes an extensive ground-truthing effort by the members and continuous assistance from the Southwest Regional Planning Commission.
- Participated with a booth in the annual Riverfest program where we presented the newly acquired small-scale aerial photographs with coverage of the entire town. These aerials are available for public review at the Town Hall.
- Obtained additional booklets, pamphlets, and a variety of documents to add to the library of materials available to the public (some by purchase and some free of charge) on topics such as the value of natural resources, how to protect open space, and how to balance conservation and economic development.
- Donated \$2,000 to the Cutter Cemetery expansion project.
- Initiated a timber harvest on the Jaffrey Town Forest with oversight by New England Forestry Consultants to conclude early in 2005.
- Renewed prestigious Tree Farm status for the Jaffrey Town Forest.
- Provided input on statutory treatment and permit activities on Class VI roads.
- Performed site visit and preliminary visual assessment of local heron rookery.
- On behalf of the Town, conducted a field investigation of the corridor containing potential nesting and foraging habitat for Blandings Turtle (*Emydoidea blandingi*) along the route of the Rail Trail, and prepared a report with aerial/map and recommendations for habitat improvements which avoid and/or reduce potential impacts. This report was submitted by the Town to the NH Fish and Game and allowed the project to move forward.

## REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

- One member continues to be active on the Contoocook River Advisory Committee and one member is active as the Town representative to the regional Monadnock Conservancy.
- Reviewed and provided feedback/approval to applicants/NHDES on nine wetlands applications, including the proposed mill revitalization project, Gilsum Pond Dam improvements, and Route 124 culvert improvements.
- Reviewed three Forestry Notifications for compliance with State requirements.
- Provided assistance and input to the Planning Board on numerous applications and attended site walks.

The members of the Conservation Commission look forward to another productive year in serving the Town in 2005. We invite citizens to attend our meetings and welcome feedback on our efforts. Thank you for your interest and support.

THE JAFFREY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (EDC) consists of business people, community leaders, and local residents with an interest in promoting the economic vitality and growth of Jaffrey. The following items have been a major focus for the EDC over the past year:

### **Jaffrey Mill Building**

The redevelopment of the Jaffrey Mill Building is due to proceed in 2005. Work has been delayed due to some changes that were made in the redevelopment plan, but the project still promises to be a major catalyst for growth that will further revitalize our downtown area. The project will create 12 new mixed-income housing units in our downtown, in addition to over 30,000 square feet of commercial and office space. Such mixed-use projects promote the preservation of historic structures and the reduction of sprawl, while facilitating alternative means of transportation. Despite the delays, the good news is that the Mill Building is still on track to become the centerpiece of a vibrant downtown area.

### **New Business Incubator**

Monadnock Business Ventures (MBV) has purchased the former W.W. Cross Building on Webster Street for use as a business incubator for start-up businesses. A fitness club (Fit-Plus) has already moved into the facility and MBV anticipates that additional start-up businesses will soon follow. Incubators are a proven system for developing small businesses that leads to quality employment opportunities and an expanded tax base for communities. Studies show that over 80% of economic development in a given area is home grown. The specialized assistance offered to start-up businesses through the Webster Street Incubator will cultivate the energy and talent already existing in Jaffrey, resulting in successful, established businesses in the future.

### **TIF District Projects**

Acquiring land to improve physical facilities and quality of life is what Tax Increment Finance (TIF) Districts are all about. A site on Union Street has been acquired by the Town for the new Community Center and the existing buildings have been removed, all with money from the Downtown TIF District. The goal for this year is to build a little league baseball field on the site and to develop plans for construction of the new Community Center. The Downtown TIF District also provided the matching funds to complete Phase I of the Rails to Trails project this year, while continuing to support our Main Street Program through its annual contribution to TEAM Jaffrey. Our other TIF District, Stone Arch Bridge, funded the installation of a water cistern for fire protection, something that was sorely needed in an area that includes New England Wood Pellets, Monadnock Disposal, Atlas Pyrotechnics, and the Transfer Station.

**Looking Ahead**

The Town has established a Revolving Loan Fund for small and start-up businesses that should begin making a real difference in 2005. Jaffrey has also received approval for three Community Reinvestment Opportunity Program (CROP) zones that offer tax credits to businesses that are expanding. The coming year will also be the first in which the Town has a marketing budget dedicated exclusively to outside business attraction. Jaffrey is a great place to do business, and everyone will benefit if we spread the word.

The Economic Development Council looks forward to the coming year and the opportunities it will present as we proceed with ongoing projects and begin new initiatives to help sustain Jaffrey's economic vitality.

In the year 2004, your Historic District Commission met 10 times to discuss business relating to the Commission's ordinance to "regulate the construction, alteration, painting, moving, demolition, or use of the structures and places" within the district. These discussions included, but were certainly not limited to, four applications filed by Jaffrey Center residents. They were:

**Application #84 – Stephen and Noel Pierce – 384 Main Street – APPLICATION RETURNED**

Addition of sign (pursuant to approval of barn usage on property) and replacement of 'Oribe Shop' sign currently on site. More information needed about proposed sign for application process to proceed.

**Application #85 – Stephen and Noel Pierce – 371 Main Street – APPROVED with CONDITION**

No Parking Signs to be added in two driveway entrances. Application approved with caveat that the signs could be recalled if deemed inappropriate when produced.

**Application #86 – Nancy Lloyd – Currier House – APPROVED**

Addition of new screen/storm door

**Application #87 – Nancy Lloyd – Currier House – APPLICATION RETURNED**

Alteration of current lighting of the Currier House sign to 'elbow spots.' Application returned to Nancy for additional information and research.

In meeting our responsibilities, the Commission communicated with other Town Committees. The Commission would like to extend its sincere thanks to the neighbors of the District for cooperating and embracing the application process and for considering the impact the changes to their houses have on the overall character of the Historic District.

The Commission cosponsored a reading of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 2004, at the Meetinghouse followed by an Ice Cream Social at Melville Academy. It was well received by Jaffrey residents as well as many people attending from surrounding towns. We will continue this event annually. Additionally, the Commission sponsored the First Annual Jaffrey Center HDC Summer Picnic to introduce the commission members to the neighbors and to foster casual communication between all parties.

**REPORT OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION**

The Commission would like to acknowledge the leadership of Rob Stephenson and the efforts of the Town of Jaffrey and the Meetinghouse Committee relating to the restoration of the Meetinghouse windows. The parties involved raised grant money and subsequently hired and then worked with Jade Mortimer of Heartwood Building and Restoration throughout the year. The project was a smashing success.

In 2004, the library continued to be a well used resource. Our material circulation increased 2.8% to an all time high of 47,732 items. In response to new technology and customer requests we added DVDs and books on CD to our audiovisual collection. We added graphic novels and popular award winners to our teen collection and met with great success there. Our large print collection also has expanded with the addition of best sellers and mysteries.

The library continues to serve the children of Jaffrey through class visits and book award programs presented in the schools. With the addition of a third group we have expanded our book clubs to cover grades two through nine. A cooperative venture with the Jaffrey-Rindge Middle School brought a special program "Smoke Screen" to the school during Red Ribbon Week in October. The Library and the Recreation Department received a Cheshire County Youth Profile grant to provide programming for middle grade students during 2004/2005. The AFTER program meets after school from 3 to 5 PM for films, games and other activities. So far the turnout has be small so if you know a child that would like to participate call either the Library or the Recreation department.

The Friends of the Library continue to help us by fund raising and by sponsoring numerous speakers, educational events, and the Summer Reading Program. Our film series and our spring and fall book groups continue to draw crowds.

In October, the Library proudly hosted the reopening of the Amos Fortune Exhibit on the third floor. The exhibit was enhanced and expanded and we invite you to come and visit. Archivist, Anne Ostendarp, did the project, which included the design and mounting of the exhibit and the conservation of the Fortune papers. The project was made possible by generous funding from the Amos Fortune Forum, and state grant funds.

We continue to receive many gifts and donations from community organizations and individuals. These gifts help us to add to our collection and expand our resources. We would especially like to thank the Jaffrey-Rindge Education Foundation, Friends of Jaffrey Recreation, Millipore, the Keith Sullivan Foundation, the Hayes Family, and the Iota Omega Chapter of Sigma Tau Delta at Franklin Pierce.

We plan to continue to provide Jaffrey with exceptional library service and we thank you for your support.

THE MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE advises the Town on matters pertaining to the use and maintenance of Jaffrey's historic Meetinghouse.

The Meetinghouse served as a venue for many events between May and October: Amos Fortune Forum (seven free lectures), Monadnock Music (two free concerts), Conant High School's 12<sup>th</sup> annual Shakespeare Festival, the 88<sup>th</sup> annual First Church Fair and eight weddings. The following Town boards and committees met in the Meetinghouse one or more times: Jaffrey Board of Selectmen, Planning Board, Board of Adjustment,

Cemetery Committee and the Historic District Commission. A free line dance was held in August, sponsored by the Village Improvement Society. In September the Jaffrey Chamber of Commerce began its monthly "After Hours" at the Meetinghouse. On June 17<sup>th</sup>—the anniversary of the raising of the Meetinghouse frame in 1775—a Meetinghouse Birthday Party was held with some historical recollections, music and appropriate refreshments. The Meetinghouse was the scene of numerous other meetings, school group visits, Elderhostel tours, and such throughout the year. The Committee along with the Jaffrey Historical Society, the VIS and the Historic District Commission cosponsored the 4<sup>th</sup> annual reading of the *Declaration of Independence* on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. The Meetinghouse was again full and the 38 volunteer readers did a marvelous job. All are invited to attend and participate. The Town of Jaffrey was honored to host on August 18<sup>th</sup> the regular meeting of the Governor and Executive Council. The Meetinghouse was active for most of the day with many local citizens attending as spectators of New Hampshire government.

The Committee made thorough inspections of the Meetinghouse on May 24<sup>th</sup> and October 18<sup>th</sup>. Between the two dates a variety of projects were undertaken, sometimes by members of the Committee and at other times by volunteers or contractors: inspection and servicing of the Town clock (largely done by Charles Marvin); recharging of fire extinguishers; repair of Exit lights; installation of a new rear screen door; and the usual touch-up interior painting. The east façade was scraped and painted by Sunshine Painting of Jaffrey. The largest project by far has been the ongoing restoration of the Meetinghouse's 50 windows. Three batches were removed, transported off-site, repaired and restored and reinstalled. The final 14 will be removed momentarily and are due to be reinstalled in May. The Town is fortunate to have had more than \$40,000 of the project funded by grants from or through the NH Division of Historical Resources.

## REPORT OF THE MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE

During the year additional donations were received to pay for bench cushions, bringing the total raised to \$1,575. These are being made from recycled stage curtains. By next season 23 cushions will be in place.

For some years there has been a desire to have a piano in the Meetinghouse for use at events. This wish became a reality with the donation to the Town of an antique Henry F. Miller Square Grand Piano. Its arrival on June 17<sup>th</sup> coincided with the Meetinghouse Birthday Party, its first use being to accompany the singing of "Happy Birthday." The Committee thanks Eugene Roe for his generous donation.

For major projects next season the Committee has recommended additional exterior painting specifically the upper tower which has not been painted since 1992. The north façade may also be included. A new water heater may be necessary and some minor electrical work is called for.

The calendar for next season is beginning to fill. Other than the usual events, two weddings have already been booked. These and other private gatherings benefit the Town through rental fees.

## REPORT OF THE MONADNOCK ADVISORY COMMISSION

THE MONADNOCK ADVISORY COMMISSION (MAC) was created by State statute and is charged to advise and guide the State of New Hampshire's Department of Resources and Economic Development on the management of State lands and leased lands on Monadnock, Gap, and Little Monadnock.

The Monadnock Master Plan Phase I improvements at Gilson Pond headquarters began in Summer 2004. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (DES) was responsible for the reconstruction of the Gilson Pond dam. DES Water Resource Bureau Chief, Jim Gallagher, PE, led MAC members on a tour of the dam site on October 28, 2004, as the project neared completion. The final estimated cost of this reconstruction is \$300,000, with \$130,000 secured by DRED from the Capital Budget appropriation and the remaining \$170,000 to be funded by the DES Dam Maintenance Fund. Gilson Pond will be allowed to refill after ice melt in Spring.

Also on October 28<sup>th</sup>, Tom Mansfield, Chief Architect and Bureau Chief of DRED's Design, Development, and Maintenance Division, presented blueprints for the family campground layout with sites, buildings, and roads identified, as well as design for the campground registration building. He expects the final cost of the building to be near \$300,000 — the remaining campground construction is estimated to be \$650,000. The Division of Parks will utilize funding from Federal Land and Water Conservation Grants where costs exceed the Capital Budget allotment. Construction of the campground should begin in May 2005 and continue through Summer.

35 applications were submitted to the PLANNING BOARD during 2004. In addition to the business noted below, a number of applicants came before the Board for nonbinding preliminary consultations.

- A) 13 site plan reviews were submitted (11 were granted, one was withdrawn, and one was accepted)
- B) Four major and ten minor condominium subdivisions were submitted (ten were granted, one was withdrawn, one was not accepted, two are pending). Seven technical subdivisions were submitted (five were approved and two were pending as of the end of the year).
- C) Three earth excavations were submitted (all were granted).

A subcommittee reported to the Board on Jaffrey's Class VI roads. Committee members walked most of the 15± miles of Jaffrey's Class VI roadways. They described and categorized the various stretches of roadways as to their suitability for future improvement. A policy outlining procedures for application and building on Class VI roads was adopted by reference as part of the Master Plan.

The Board also voted to adopt the Economic Development Plan by reference in the Master Plan. The Board commends the Economic Development Council for drafting this valuable planning tool.

This year, the Board has proposed several changes to our ordinances which will recognize changes to State law and New Hampshire Supreme Court decisions. A partial list of changes include: a new description of Zoning Board of Adjustment criteria for variances; provisioning for condominium form of ownership in all districts where traditional residential ownership is permitted; revised wetland definitions and adoption of nonpoint source pollution best management practices; revised scheduling of impact fee assessments; requirement for a minimum 15-foot housing setback for new construction in the downtown Main Street district; and provisioning for the partial release of bonds/letters of credit within the Excavation Ordinance. Several wording changes have also been made to the Land Use Plan and regulations. Proposed amendments to the Land Use Plan and regulations are available and will be voted on by the residents of Jaffrey.

This upcoming year, the Board will be working with the Southwest Region Planning Commission to update the Town's Master Plan. The Master Plan was last updated in 1997. The process will likely take the better part of two years and,

in 2005, will include basic data studies and a public visioning process. Southwest Region Planning Commission has also been asked to update the Town's impact fees, which have not been updated since 1990. This study was to be conducted during 2004, but it was not practical because data from the town-wide revaluation was not available.

I would like to thank all the Board members for their time and service to the Town. I welcome Rob Deschenes and John McCarthy, our newest Board members. I would also like to recognize and thank Steve Walker, who departed from the Board this year.

Finally, I would like to invite any residents with interest in serving on the Planning Board to contact me. Applicants will be considered by the Board for present or future positions, subject to final approval and appointment by the Board of Selectmen.

2004 proved to be another busy year for TEAM Volunteers. Starting right off in January the Economic Restructuring helped to finalize plans with the Planning Board and local merchants to adopt a more business friendly amendment and definitions for the downtown sign ordinance . Tourism promotion continued with our Hospitality Brochure, advertising downtown with the NH Office of Travel and Tourism Publications, and the introduction this year of Christmas Overture, a pre-holiday getaway package. Perhaps our most noted project, the Park Theatre Restoration effort, took a giant leap forward as the committee raised the funds necessary to acquire the property for renovation. This was done with a wonderful \$50,000 matching grant, courtesy of the Bean Foundation. Suddenly a three to eight year project seemed much closer.

The Organization Committee kept busy with the production of Riverfest and the Jaffrey Summer Concert Series, highlighted by a presentation of the 12<sup>th</sup> NH Regiment Governors Horse Guards, 12<sup>th</sup> NH Regiment Artillery, and the 12<sup>th</sup> NH Regiment Serenade Band sup[plied Jaffrey residents and visitors with a wonderful peek into our Civil War Era History. Congratulations are due to Cathy Furze, Country Bridals and Formal Wear, Downtown Jaffrey Merchant of the Year, and Cindy Foley, TEAM Jaffrey Volunteer of the Year who were recognized at our November Volunteer Recognition and Awards Night at the American Legion.

The Promotion Committee once again served up great special events with Winter Carnival, Easter “Eggs”travaganza, Trick Or treat On The Town, and the record breaking 5<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Scarecrows On The Common.

On the Design end of our four committees, the Buddy Monument and Rails to Trails entrance sported newly landscaped grounds with funds raised from the annual Garden Tour, and downtown sported seasonal and holiday plantings as well. 12 new building were marked as Jaffrey Landmarks in the Downtown Jaffrey National Register Historic District, and following the annual Kitchen Tour, the Design Team unveiled a new Jaffrey Christmas Ornament. The New Ornament displays a view of Main Street looking to Mount Monadnock, and they are still available for sale for \$8. Proceeds go to the sign and facade grant programs.

Jaffrey again was noticed at the NH Main Street Center Excellence On Main Street Awards with Cindy and Aylmer Given receiving top honors for Best New facade rehab under \$10,000 and Cathy Furze of Country Bridals top honors for “Best Retail Event” for the Jaffrey Bridal Show. Outstanding Board Member from Jaffrey was Richard Olson, and Pat DuMont, TEAM Historian, was named as Outstanding Jaffrey Volunteer. Jaffrey was again nominated for a “Great American Main Street Award” for the community’s effort towards downtown revitalization. When all was said and done, TEAM Volunteers have amassed over 35,000 hours over the past five years working to better downtown Jaffrey. The National Trust values volunteer time at \$16.75 per hour, so that makes an investment of \$586,250.00 by volunteers working to better downtown Jaffrey. We couldn’t do this without the volunteers and our loyal investors. Congratulations and thank you to you all!”

# **STAFF REPORTS**



Some day soon I hope to be able to write this annual report and not have to mention anything about our water and wastewater projects. However, we are not there just yet.

The Selectmen put forth a proposal to the Town at the 2004 Town Meeting to purchase water from a private concern. This water would serve as the third source of water for the Jaffrey Water System. Currently, we have two wells, the Turnpike Well and Contoocook Lake Well, which provide all the water for the system. The State of New Hampshire requires us to have a third source as a back-up to these two sources of water. We simply want to ensure that we put forward a proposal to the Town that is the most cost-effective solution possible. The voters turned down the proposal put forward at the 2004 Town Meeting, and raised valid points. In turn, the Selectmen initiated a study committee to assist the Selectmen in finding what solution would work best for the Town. The committee issued a report to the Selectmen which is under review.

The wastewater project is a requirement of the State of New Hampshire and US EPA to upgrade our treatment requirements before the effluent is discharged into the Contoocook River. We have been working on this project for 12 years. It is expected that the Selectmen will propose funds in 2005 for the design of the upgrade, and that in 2006, a proposal will come forward for the construction funding. We have reviewed all possible solutions to this requirement with the expectation that the final treatment design proposal is the best plan for the Town at the lowest cost.

Another project that has recently occupied our time and interest is the on-going revaluation of property (aka "reval"). The Town hired a revaluation firm, Vision Appraisal, to begin the reval in 2004 and the process will be completed in early Spring of 2005. The last reval was completed in 1996. As we all know, property values shot upwards in the late 1990s and early part of the 2000s decade. Thus, the new valuations the Town will post to your property will undoubtedly increase, and most properties will, at least, double in their assessment. It is important not to panic when you receive your value notice in April or May. The increased overall town valuation will cause the overall tax rate to drop, thus you should not take your revised value and use the 2004 tax rate to estimate your new tax amount. We will make all efforts to communicate the reval process as it unfolds. Briefly, the process will include a mailed notice to all property owners of their new values. When you receive that notice, it will include information on how to meet with our

assessors to review your value if you choose to do so. This would provide you an opportunity to have the assessors explain to you how they determined your value. After you meet with the assessors, they may revise your assessment. All assessments will then be turned over to the Selectmen. These assessments will be used for the tax billing to take place in the Fall of 2005. If you are not satisfied with the assessment used for the Fall tax billing, then you have the right to file an abatement application no later than March 1, 2006. This will allow the Selectmen and our assessors to review your assessment again. Based upon that decision, if you still have a disagreement on the assessment you have the right to appeal the assessment to the Board of Tax and Land Appeals or to the Superior Court.

As always, I would like to thank all town employees for the efforts they make every day to provide a high quality of service to you, the residents of Jaffrey.

Five Firefighters completed Firefighter Level I Certification and Seven Firefighters completed Firefighter Level II Certification in 2004. As Chief of the Jaffrey Fire Department I am proud to say that at the current time the Fire Department has 13 Certified Level I Fire Fighters and 12 Certified Level II Fire Fighters. All members of the Jaffrey Fire Department are certified at this time. We will continue to train to the best of our abilities and resources. In 2005 we will be interviewing potential new Firefighters to become members of the Jaffrey Fire Department. Anyone interesting in becoming a Firefighter can stop by the fire station or call and talk to the Fire Chief.

The Fire Department is asking the voters to support our request to replace or refurbish the 1987 Fire truck 16-M2 that is no longer in service due to structural frame corrosion. We are hopeful that the voters will support this warrant article which will allow the department to continue to provide superior fire protection and emergency services to our fellow citizens. In future years we will be requesting that the annual amount of funds that are placed into the Capitol Reserve Fund be adjusted to meet the ever increasing costs of fire apparatus and equipment. We feel that this will be in the best interest of the community and the taxpayers.

Life Safety Code and Fire Prevention continue to be a high priority for the Jaffrey Fire Department. The Fire Chief will continue to inspect all new construction, places of assembly, apartment occupancies, industrial and commercial occupancies, fire alarm systems and sprinkler systems for compliance with all state and local applicable Life Safety and Fire codes.

The Jaffrey Fire Department would like to thank the anonymous citizens who donated an all terrain vehicle (ATV) and trailer to the Jaffrey Fire Department. Your generosity will allow the Jaffrey Fire Department to expand the ability of our services to the citizens and visitors of Jaffrey and to the surrounding communities. We would also like to thank all the citizens, groups, businesses, individuals and fire departments who have helped us out in one way or another in times of need over the past year.

The Fire Chief and Assistant Fire Chief would like to recognize and thank the members of the Jaffrey Fire Department, our families and those of our fellow firefighters for there continued dedication and support.

This past year (2004) has been the most difficult of any in the 10 years that I've served as the Town's Welfare Director. I say that not only because I over ran the budget by \$2,181 or because the total spent on shelter/housing was \$76,963.57 which is slightly more than the total budget just four years ago (\$76,108.73 in 2000) but because it has become increasingly difficult to find affordable housing for families at the lower end of the wage scale. According to government statistics the average cost of a two-bedroom apartment in the Monadnock region is \$748.00/month. In order to afford that the average worker would need to earn \$16.79 an hour just \$4.00 more an hour than the average wage in our area. It doesn't take a math genius to figure out that the slightest disruption to a family's budget can cause serious problems.

The surest answer to this situation is to build more affordable housing. Sadly there is nothing under construction or nothing being planned. Until such time as there are more units built more of your tax dollars will be consumed subsidizing housing.

## REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The employees of the POLICE DEPARTMENT were put to the test in 2004, and passed with honors. As the result of the retirement of Sgt. Reynolds, and Ptlm. LaFlamme resigning to accept a position in his hometown, the department fell two officers short. It took almost the whole year to recruit replacements who possessed the high level of integrity and intelligence currently in place within the force. That left the rest of us to pick up the slack.

Calls for service actually increased from 2003, almost reaching 5,800. Unfortunately, a significant amount of police resources were wasted once again during the year as police responded to over 600 calls resulting from false alarms, irresponsible animal ownership and abuse of the 911 emergency system. If ever there was a year when we needed those abuses to disappear, it was 2004.

Officers handled several serious motor vehicle crashes, including one that resulted in the death of a Jaffrey woman. More than a dozen burglaries were investigated, including one where a resident was savagely attacked and another involving a home invasion. Most were solved by Jaffrey officers, including those two.

Incidents involving transgressions committed by juveniles presented additional challenges during the year. Officers arrested 113 juveniles for committing crimes while attending school in Jaffrey or in the community at large. Incidents of substance abuse, violence and disorderly conduct were common behaviors associated with those arrests.

Somehow, officers found time to continue presenting important crime prevention or community service programs. Another Citizen's Police Academy Class was held, a Police / Community Day reached hundreds of children and their parents, Ride-A-Long engagements, building tours and safety presentations were active throughout the year.

Of special note was the high level of community service employees performed during their off duty time. Police volunteers participated in several TEAM Jaffrey and Chamber of Commerce events. The Police Association presented a college scholarship to a graduating Conant student to pursue a degree in Criminal Justice. Several Jaffrey families were assisted with challenges they faced during Thanksgiving and Christmas and cash donations were made to various local organizations.

As your Police Chief I pledge to continue seeking efficient and creative ways to provide the police services you demand and need. I urge you to behave in ways that will minimize the amount of your tax dollars needed to meet those demands.

## REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Encourage friends and relatives to be responsible pet owners, exercise care when using building alarms and only use the 911 system to report emergencies.

Take a part in supervising young people close to you so they receive the guidance and direction needed to become contributing members of society. They are the future of Jaffrey and doing so will be a good investment.

**Cemeteries/Parks and Commons Division:** In 2004, the Town contracted out the landscaping maintenance activities to a private contractor. The Town performed 15 full-body and cremation burials. The staff participated in the review and updating of the cemetery regulations with the Cemetery Commission. Staff also assisted the Commission with the proposed Cutter Cemetery expansion.

**Highway Division:** Ingalls Road reconstruction project is nearing completion. The stone walls along the roadway were reconstructed by Given Masonry at a cost of \$179,270. The wearing surface of pavement was installed. The remaining work is the placement of bounds, which should be completed in 2005. In addition to the paving on Ingalls Road, Great Road was reclaimed and resurfaced from Gilmore Pond Road westerly approximately 6000 feet. An event of significance was the washing out of a section of Town Farm Road on April 2nd resulting from heavy rain and suspected beaver dam failure upstream. The section of roadway damaged in this incident was approximately 100 feet long, approximately 200 feet west of Lehtinen Road. The crew was able to repair the cross drain and reconstruct the roadway and reopen to traffic in 2 days, an astounding effort! The Highway Crews performed maintenance on over 64 miles of Town roads. A new Caterpillar 928G front-end loader was delivered. The highway crew assisted other Departments throughout the year including the Water, Sewer, Fire and Police.

**Wastewater Division:** The wastewater treatment plant processed approximately 180.0 million gallons (average 492,000 gallons per day) of wastewater in 2004. Plans and specifications were completed for the improvements at the Hadley Road Pump Station, project was advertised out and bids received. The low bidder was Weststate Construction in the amount of \$454,534 and should be complete in Spring 2005. Funding for Hadley Road improvements is being provided by the sewer users, Jaffrey taxpayers, State Aid Grant and Revolving Loan Fund and EPA grant. The Town continued in its negotiations with the NHDES and EPA to comply with stringent discharge limits. On June 17, 2004, the USEPA issued a consent order that requires the Town to comply with these standards by completing a significant upgrade to our treatment system by September 30, 2007. The water quality standard the Town must comply with will prevent degradation of the Contoocook River. Last year the Town lost the Chief Operator, Lew Gregory, who left the Town to work in the private sector. Lew stayed on in a part-time position while the search for a new operator proceeded. Several candidates were interviewed and offers of employment made, but unfortunately offers were turned down. Unable to hire an operator, the firm of Woodard & Curran was hired in March to run the facility. A

comprehensive request for proposals (RFP) was prepared by staff and advertised with proposals

due in early January 2005. The highway and water staff replaced approximately 1050 of old 6" vitrified clay with 8" PVC sewer main on Turnpike Road. The section in the vicinity of the Post Office had settled and was no longer flowing as required. The cost for this work was \$82,392. The sewer main on Stratton Road was also problematic. Video inspection revealed the pipe is in poor condition. The Town will be rehabilitating this main in 2005. There remains a significant Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) problem in the collection system. This extraneous I/I must be addressed as it will become expensive to treat especially once the new facility is on-line. In late July and August, the treatment facility experienced a significant upset resulting in offensive odors emanating from the facility. The upset was apparently caused by an unusual discharge from a local industry and the activities at the Hadley Road Pump Station. The Town, its contract operator, consultants and the industry representatives and the NHDES worked together to resolve the problem, although the odors persisted for several weeks until the treatment process stabilized.

**Water Division:** The Department produced 125.6 million gallons (average 343,000 gallons per day) from two groundwater wells and provided potable drinking water to approximately 1,530 accounts in Jaffrey and Rindge. The Department, in consultation with the Fire Chief prioritized the replacement of hydrants. As a result thirteen hydrants were installed or replaced with three repaired. Many that remain to be replaced are located on old water mains that need to be replaced. One hundred sixty-six (166) residential and commercial water meters were installed or replaced. Town Highway and Water staff installed approximately 2040 lf of HDPE water main in "Little Michigan" to replace old 2" galvanized pipe, which has been prone to breaks and freezing. Staff assisted in the Turnpike Road sewer replacement project. The Selectmen formed an advisory committee to review and study previous water reports and to make a recommendation for additional water source. This committee met through the summer and was assisted by staff. The Committee's recommendations included short-term actions, which includes the installation of redundant wells at our existing well sites, assess contamination at Contoocook well and determine if an increase in the pumping rate of Contoocook well is possible. Mid-term recommendations include exploring the Annett State Forest area as a groundwater source, negotiate with the NHDES to reactivate Bullet Pond and finalize negotiations with the Barking Dog Water Company to purchase water from this private company.

**Engineering Division:** The Town saw its first Town Engineer, Jim Donison, leave in November 2003 to pursue his own private engineering business. In March 2004, Doug Starr was welcomed as Town Engineer. Doug brings to the Town the valuable experience of working for other NH municipalities and most recently for the NHDES. The Town Engineer provided valuable service to the departments above. In addition, the engineer supervised the construction of the “Rails to Trails” project that was bid out in the Fall of 2004 and constructed by Hutter Construction. The Engineer also designed the sewer replacement project on Turnpike Road, reviewed subdivision applications for the Planning Board, and assisted in the demolition of the Bean fiberglass factory project, making way for a new Community Center. These tasks together with the water and sewer challenges have kept the Engineer busy.

**TRANSFER STATION AND RECYCLING CENTER**

**Solid Waste/Transfer/Recycling Division:** Material received and processed at the Transfer Station in 2004 included the following approximate amounts: 1,017 tons compactor waste, 663 tons bulky waste including construction and demolition debris, 187 tons recycled material (plastics, paper, corrugated), and 1,037 tons light iron, 4.7 tons of aluminum, 200 televisions, computer monitors and microwaves, 164 propane tanks, and 148 freon containing items.

In 2003, the Board of Selectmen appointed a citizens advisory committee to review operations of the Transfer Station & Recycling Center (TSRC) with the goal of saving the Town money. The Committee presented fourteen (14) recommendations to the Board many of which the Department has or is in the process of implementing.

The goal of the Department was to implement those recommendations that would make an improvement to the operations of the facility. To address concerns that businesses in town could not use the recycling portion of the facility, the Ordinance was changed and a process developed whereby businesses can apply and obtain a permit to dispose of recyclables at TSRC. To better accommodate the schedule of the users, the hours of the facility were made more uniform. Through cooperative effort of the employees, the TSRC is closed for only four (4) holidays throughout the year; New Years, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving and Christmas, and wherever possible the days of operation were made uniform. Revised dump stickers were issued to residents and authorized users. This remains a sensitive issue for many folks. The staff is checking for valid stickers and while most residents are cooperative and respectful, I have experienced first hand the belligerence of a resident who did not have a valid sticker. A Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day was held in conjunction with the Town of Rindge on August 14<sup>th</sup>. Although the project was well advertised, only 19 residents took advantage of this collection. The regulations were revised to adjust the fees charged for those items for which the Town must pay a special disposal fee. The fees collected now cover these special charges.

Several operational improvements include the installation of a new compactor for household refuse which is a byproduct of the newly renegotiated contract with the hauler which is also saving the town \$10 per ton. To obtain better pricing on recyclable commodities, the Town joined the Northeast Resource Recovery Association, which competitively bids commodities and supplies. As a direct result of the Town joining this Association, we no longer are required to bale newspapers, paperboard and the like. Also a second baler was procured which will make the baling of plastics and other hard to bale items more efficient.

Signage was procured to replace old, outdated signs. While it is an improvement, additional signs are to be put up to further assist residents in the use of the facility. We also investigated improving the access road by paving it, but unfortunately there were not sufficient funds available for this work.

To inform and educate the residents on the use of the facility, an informational flyer was prepared and distributed. This flyer detailed the recyclables collected at our facility and avenues of disposal for other materials. The flyer also included the operating calendar. We also utilized the Town's website and community access channel to educate and inform residents about changes at the facility, including operating schedules.

The biggest challenge to overall improvements at the TSRC is directly related to the staff at the facility. After much difficulty in obtaining a contractor, the department staff, under the direction of Bob Gordon, is in the process of installing a restroom and changing room at the facility. Although portable propane heaters were obtained to provide a modicum of heat for the employees, this temporary measure is ineffective at best. To provide minimal heat to the facility, the building needs to be insulated. There are sections of the roof that are leaking, which would preclude the placement of any insulation. Sealing the roof is obviously a priority, solutions that raise other problems such as roof loading, etc.

In FY05 we will continue to make improvements at the facility. Proposed work includes the construction of a loading dock area which will permit adequate storage of materials to maximize the type of commodities sent out and obtain better pricing by sending out dedicated loads. We will continue to work to a solution to insulating the building. We will always work toward and entertain suggestions from residents to make improvements to the facility.

This past year was the beginning for two exciting projects in Jaffrey. The first was the continuation of the Rails to Trails program and the completion of the trail from Rindge to the American Legion field. The Recreation Department will work to maintain the trail and post informative signs along the trail in the future. The second is the beginning of our Jaffrey Community Center on the old Bean Fiberglass site off Stratton Road. Thanks to the generosity of the downtown district and D.D. Bean Foundation, we are off to a great start with demolition and ground clearing to be completed in January. We have applied for a Land And Water Conservation Grant to build a new baseball / softball field on the Community Center site, giving us two fields in Jaffrey (the other one is at the American Legion). The Community Center site is a wonderful location right next to the river, Children's Woods, and Rails to Trails.

New programs and activities for all ages were also added in 2004. Our travel program continues, averaging two trips per month to events from Stars on Ice to the Rockettes Christmas Show. We also offered some trips during no-school days. Summer Programs included a new one half day camp for children ages 3 – 5 and a revamping of the Adventure Camp for middle school youth. Other summer activities included expanded swim lessons and family fun day at Contoocook Beach. With the start of the new school year, we began an after

school program for middle school students that was partially funded by a Cheshire County Grant.

In the upcoming year, we will be working to finalize the site plan for the new Community Center and enhancing the Rails to Trails. We are also working more closely with the surrounding towns in joint programs involving travel and middle school summer camps. New programs are always in the works for all ages and we are proud of our facilities at Humiston Field, Contoocook Beach, and Thorndike Pond.

The Office of the Regional Prosecutor experienced both personnel and organizational changes in 2003. Lisa Perkins, my administrative assistant relocated with her family to Florida in mid-summer. She did a great job. Luckily we found, and Lisa was able to train her replacement, Amy St. Cyr. Amy was a quick study, and adapted easily to her new duties and workplace milieu.

Later in the fall we sustained another loss from our staff. Jessica Schlamp resigned as assistant prosecutor to prepare for the birth of her new baby. Filling the assistant prosecutor position once again was proving to be a difficult task! Finding an attorney who, was able to prosecute 20 hours a week, could balance that work with another legal practice, and had some prosecutorial experience, has always been a tough slot to fill.

Coincidentally, at the close of last year the Town of Rindge decided to withdraw from the regional prosecutor program. Now the regional prosecutor serves the towns and police departments of Jaffrey, Peterborough and Dublin. This was the configuration of the program up until 2001, when Rindge joined the consortium.

We handled over 1,376 cases in 2003. Again, DWI, domestic violence assault and various motor vehicle offenses, make up the largest portion of matters that are contested in Court.

I, my staff and the police departments we represent, are committed to seeking justice for everyone involved in a particular case. I welcome questions from anyone, whether having to do with the criminal justice system in general or about my special role as prosecutor. As always, I am available to discuss particular cases with defendants, victims, attorneys and witnesses.

It is hoped that the snags in our becoming a tenant in the new Courthouse will be worked out quickly in 2004. I look forward to such a move, just as the Jaffrey Police Department (which has so graciously and generously provided our workplace) looks forward to expanding into our present space.
