The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am. The attendants were asked to stand as the Boy Scouts from Troop 33: Tyler Bennett and Ben Chesney presented the colors and led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. After which Hannah Howard, a sophomore from Conant High sang the “Star Spangled Banner.”

The moderator, Marc Tieger, the said the following: “Good morning. Sometime in the late 1960’s or early 1970’s these words were written by Alice Lehtonen who was the author of Volume III in the History of Jaffrey. They are as appropriate today as they were then and for years and years before:

“Jaffrey has a healthy social climate, evident at that ancient New England institution, the Town Meeting. Here democracy can be seen at work. Here all voters have a chance to say their say as well as cast their ballots. Here it is often clear that relative newcomers on the voting list have as much interest in Jaffrey’s well-being as the older residents. All Jaffrey people take pride in their town, holding their heads high, even as Monadnock that towers above all.”

Budget Committee Chairman Norm Langevin moved and addressed the article.

Mr. Langevin introduced the Budget Committee. He went on to explain the budget process.

Mr. Langevin stated that the budget had no fat and that the biggest “hits” in the budget were mostly to do with the County and State in areas of pensions, emergency dispatch and past promises by the state in the area of the five million dollar sewer bond.

Mr. Langevin encouraged folks to look at their taxes bills and see how it is

allocated to 4 different areas (School at 47%, Town 33%, County 12%, and State School 8%- 2011).

Mr. Langevin mentioned that last year's increases to the town were offset by the town being able to use some monies in the town's reserve fund.

After many comments, statements and questions the article was moved to a vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Bill Graf was recognized and he moved to restrict reconsideration of this article.

So seconded and carried.

Mr. Tieger called for a short ten minute recess so that any of the late comers to the meeting could check in.

Selectwoman Kathy Batchelder was recognized. She wished to publicly thank Andy Webber for refurbishing the Town Seal (which is a wooden, 5 foot plus oval with gold lettering, which used to be on one of the Old Mill buildings in downtown). She pointed it out on the stage behind the Selectmen. Mrs. Batchelder asked Andy to please stand and everyone gave a round of applause for his wonderful work.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be deposited into the Cemetery Trees Trust Fund established in 2007. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

With no discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$22,400 from the Property Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund for purposes of conducting the second segment of a four year property revaluation program in 2012. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectwoman Jeanne LaBrie moved and addressed the article.
With no discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

The following article is the original article that was posted:

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$15,000 to be deposited into the Municipal Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund established in 2009 under the provisions of RSA 35:1 and to further name the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund in the best interest of the Town or to take any action thereon. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

The Board of Selectmen replaced it with the following:

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$65,000 to be deposited into the Municipal Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund established in 2009 under the provisions of RSA 35:1 and to further name the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund in the best interest of the Town or to take any action thereon. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectwoman Kathy Batchelder moved and addressed this article. She explained that due to some changes with Article 17 it was decided by the Board of Selectmen that the dollar amount for this article be increased due to concern that this fund, which has approximately \$25,000 in uncommitted funds in it, needs to have additional funds added to cover any unanticipated repairs or improvements for any municipal building.

After a couple of questions and comments it was moved by Kevin Chamberlain to amend this article to the original \$15,000. He presented the Moderator with his written amendment. His amendment was seconded. The floor was then open for discussion on the amendment.

John Field moved that the amendment be voted on by secret ballot, he too presented the Moderator with signatures.

After thirty minutes of question, comments and discussion the question on whether to amend the article was put to a vote. Mr. Tieger instructed everyone to use their "A" ballots, the polls were open for a sufficient amount of time, and the results were:

No – 70

The amendment was defeated.

**while all of the voting and tabulating was occurring the meeting continued on to the following articles.

Discussion on this article resumed just before Article 17.

Art.14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50,000 and to deposit said sum into the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve fund established in 1997 under RSA 35:1 for the purpose of purchasing new or refurbishing highway equipment. Recommended by the budget Selectmen and Budget Committee.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed the article.

After one question and no other discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$238,000, with the source of funds being \$12,000 from the capital reserve fund established

in 1996 for the purchase of new or refurbishing existing firefighting and/or rescue equipment and \$226,000 from an Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) to be used to purchase new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). The \$12,000 from the reserve fund will be utilized as the Town's 5% share of the total cost of the equipment. In the event the grant is not awarded the department shall be authorized to utilize the funds appropriated for the purchase of SCBA bottles to replace existing bottles that are in need of replacement. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

Selectman Don MacIsaac moved and addressed the article.
With no discussion the article was moved to vote.

The article passed by voice vote.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This new equipment will replace a 1960 vintage compressor cascade filter system that is beyond its useful life and parts are difficult to acquire and /or are unavailable. This equipment is a very important part of the fire department operations as this equipment produces the breathing air for the firefighters self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) allowing them to breath clean safe air when they are entering a hazardous environment. The uncommitted balance of the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Account as of Dec 31, 2012 is \$71,568.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$75,000 to be deposited into the Municipal Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund established in 2010 under the provisions of RSA 35:1. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. The Building Maintenance Capital Reserve was created upon the recommendation of both the Capital Improvements Plan Committee and the Municipal Facilities Committee in 2009 for the purpose of funding major building maintenance needs. Anticipated expenditures for 2013 will be repair to duct work at the Library (\$35,000) and roof replacement at the Highway Garage (\$60,000). The current uncommitted balance of this capital reserve account as of Dec 31, 2012 is \$42,790.

2013 LAYMAN'S WARRANT



Art.16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50,000 and to deposit said sum into the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve fund established in 1997 under RSA 35:1 for the purpose of purchasing new or refurbishing highway equipment. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. By putting a portion of anticipated costs aside, a large jump in the tax rate or the need to borrow will be avoided. Should Article 13 be approved, the balance in the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Account would be \$70,449.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$20,000 and to deposit said sum into the Fire Department Capital Reserve fund established in 1998 under RSA 35:1 for the purpose of purchasing new or refurbishing existing firefighting and/or rescue equipment. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: A Capital Reserve fund is like a savings account for future expenditures. By adding funds to the capital reserve this year allows for the fund to be increased in small increments which in turn will have a less effect on the budget and tax rate for future Fire Department Capital Expenditures. Should Article 14 be approved, the uncommitted balance in the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund would be \$36,568.

Art 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000 for preliminary design of a new Town Office building, including preliminary site design, geotechnical, preliminary programming and design of new town office at or near the Goodnow Street property, plan for temporary transitioning of town office operations and related work. This will be a non-lapsing appropriation per RSA 32:7, VI and will not lapse until this phase of the project is completed or by December 31, 2015. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This sum is requested to commence design of a new Town Office Building to be located at the site of the existing Town Office Building. The scope of work under this phase will result in a set of preliminary schematics (approximately 15% design plans) for a new Town Office which is to include a preliminary floor plan and building elevations.

Also included will be geotechnical investigation and other work necessary for preliminary building design. A preliminary cost estimate will also be available at the end of this phase. Should this article pass, the next phase would include seeking funding (at future town meeting) for completion of the design and bidding phase of the project.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$5,000 to be deposited into the Land Acquisition Capital Reserve Fund established in 2008 under the provisions of RSA 35:1. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This article will place \$5,000 into the Land Acquisition Capital Reserve for future purchase of land or conservation easements. The current balance of the account as of 12/31/2012 is \$15,000.23.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800 to support the Southwestern Community Services, Inc. for the ensuing year. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Southwestern Community Services, Inc. (SCS), a private non-profit Community Action Agency has submitted this request to the Town. The submitted petition lacked the necessary registered voter signatures. The Board of Selectmen voted to support this article and to place it on the Town Meeting Warrant. This request is the same as the 2012 appropriation and is less than 1% of the \$669,721 value of services provided by SCS to Jaffrey residents in 2012. Representatives of SCS have met with the Budget Committee. 2012 Request - \$3,800.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Stone Arch Bridge Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD encompasses all of the Industrial District which is bordered by Route 202 along Nutting Road and extending south toward Turnpike Road. The Stone Arch Bridge TIFD funds the bond payments for the intersection and bridge improvements from Route 202 onto Old Sharon Road and the extension of the water mains from DD Bean through Hadley Road to Old Sharon Road ending

at Maria Drive. This financing plan is the same as presented and approved in 2012.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Downtown Tax Increment Finance District Financing Plan. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: The Downtown TIFD includes the Downtown District and the Main Street program area. The TIFD supports Team Jaffrey, the bond for the community field site, and the provision of matching funds for the ongoing remediation at the former Elite Laundry site. This financing plan is the same as presented and approved in 2012

Art 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept as a Class V Town road Windy Fields Lane which has been built to Town specifications at no cost to the Town of Jaffrey. Windy Fields Lane is shown and described on a certain plan entitled "Sheet Title: Proposed Subdivision Plan, Project: Windy Fields Subdivision" dated February, 2002 recorded in Cabinet 12, Drawer 7 #90 at the Cheshire County Registry of Deeds. Acceptance of Windy Fields Lane as shown on said plan as a Class V Town road shall be subject to all conditions of the Town, its Boards and Departments having been satisfied. Submitted by petition.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article. One of the ways for a new road to become a public road is that Town Meeting must decide to "accept" the road after it has been "dedicated" to the Town. It must meet all Town road construction specifications as determined by the Planning Board and Public Works Department. The developer of the subdivision is deceased. The proponents of this article (Residents) seek to have the roadway accepted as a Class V roadway. As-built plans of the subdivision have been submitted.

Art. 24. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for support of the Jaffrey-Rindge Memorial Ambulance, a non-profit agency or take any action relating there to. Submitted by petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region. 2012 Request - \$20,000.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 for the support of the Monadnock Community Early Learning Center, a non-profit agency, or take any other action relating thereto. Submitted by Petition. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.

LAYMAN'S LANGUAGE: This is a petition article that we receive annually and provides a benefit to Jaffrey and the region. 2012 Request - \$8,000.

Art. 26. INDEFINITE DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY



Prior to 1999, a number of articles appeared on the Town Warrant each year delegating specific powers to the Board of Selectmen and the Library Trustees. These articles are usually referred to as “boilerplate articles.” During the 1999 annual meeting, Jaffrey’s citizens voted (Articles 32-38) to “authorize indefinitely, until specific rescision of such authority” the Selectmen and the Library Trustees to undertake various actions and, therefore, to no longer include these articles on future Town Meeting Warrants. The Town of Jaffrey now has seven such warrant articles, which are listed below for your reference:

1) ACCEPTANCE OF GRANTS

3) TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH RSA 33:7, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescision of such authority, the Selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes?

4) ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS, LEGACIES, AND DEVISES

Shall the Town accept the provisions of NH RSA 31:19, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefi-

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH RSA 31:95-e, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescision of such authority, the Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property that may be offered to the Town for any public purpose? The Selectmen must hold a public hearing before accepting such a gift, and the acceptance shall not bind the Town to raise, appropriate, or expend any public funds for the operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of such equipment.

7) TRANSFER OF TAX LIENS AND SALE OF TAX DEED PROPERTY

Shall the Town adopt the provisions of NH RSA 80:80, providing that any town, during an annual meeting, may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescision of such authority, the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Deed by either conveying said property back to its original owner(s) for consideration equal to all associated unpaid property taxes, interest, and expenses, or to sell said property at public auction, or to otherwise dispose of property as justice may require?

REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER FINANCIAL REPORTING AND ON COMPLIANCE AND OTHER MATTERS BASED ON AN AUDIT OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PERFORMED IN ACCORDANCE WITH *GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS*

To the Board of Selectmen
Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2011, which collectively comprise the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's basic financial statements and have issued our report thereon dated August 13, 2012. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

Management of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over financial reporting. In planning and performing our audit, we considered the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's internal control over financial reporting.

A *deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A *material weakness* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Town's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Town of Jaffrey, New Hampshire's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not

express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*



BOARD OF SELECTMEN



Safety of our citizens is the paramount concern in all we do. Cancellation of this year's Festival of Fireworks was an unwelcomed incident. A profound thanks to Chief Oswalt on the professional manner this incident was handled. Despite the significant loss of income to the Jaffrey Chamber and the charities it supports, the Jaffrey Air Park and Atlas Fireworks, this tragedy brought us together as a town. Thank you for your understanding and support.

The Town Offices has seen a significant turnover in personnel with the loss of our Finance Director, Town Manager, and Building Inspector. Our thanks to Pam Bernier, Mike Hartman and Dave Baron for their years of contribution to the Town of Jaffrey. We wish them well; their successors have big shoes to fill.

The year was also marked by the completion of several projects which have been ongoing.

- Main St. dam repairs have been completed.
- We received our grant for 50% funding for water line to the Stone Arch TIF district. Water line installation is substantially completed and will be finished in early 2013.
- Our 3rd water source, Squantum Well, has been completed and is on line.
- Elite Laundry clean-up has been progressing; initial treatment has been successful. Remaining efforts include ongoing monitoring and disposition of the property which will be addressed in 2013.
- Gilmore Pond Culvert replacement has been completed.

Our main emphasis this year was addressing the potential recovery of the \$6 M State Aid Grant (SAG) promised as part of our \$18M Waste Water Treatment Facility upgrade. 2013 will be the first year that the full effect of the loss of this anticipated state payment will be felt in our tax rate. Toward the goal of getting the state to pay its bills, we have been instrumental in forming a coalition of affected towns to raise overall awareness and to get this issue on the radar screens of legislators running for statewide elective office. Together in partnership with the NH Municipal Association, we are part of a coalition of about 35 municipalities who are working to get this issue resolved. We have worked hard in building this coalition, getting towns to issue resolutions, and we have made many presentations, not only to other towns, but also to Governor Hassan's Budget Transition Team and

other state officials. Our goal is to get the state to pay its bills as required by law. Legislation has been introduced for the 2013 Legislative Session that calls for an appropriation of about \$9M which represents the first two installments of the state aid grants. The Governor's Recommended Budget is due to the Legislature 2/15/13; Legislative Budget Approval is scheduled for 6/30/13 when it is presented to the Governor for her signature. Bottom line is that we have made this our top priority; we have made progress; there is lot more to do. We know that "Jaffrey is MAD AS HELL" about this. We'll keep doing our part; our Legislators have committed to do their part; we may need your help also.

Meanwhile our infrastructure is in need of upgrading. We must move forward on replacing our Town Offices. Structural issues, specifically the sagging 2nd floor, are requiring immediate fixes. The time for studying alternatives has passed. The path to a new Town Office is a 3-year journey which we must start now to minimize the "throw-away" fixes required for the current facility. This year's warrant will include funding for the initial feasibility studies and action plan to build a new Town Office on the current site. In the interim we still need to make the entrance to the current Town Office ADA compliant. This is a commitment we made to the Federal government at least 5 years ago; our grant funding is predicated on fulfilling this commitment.

Meanwhile we must continue other infrastructure upgrades as required. Last year we were forced to replace the boilers at the Library. However, the full benefit of that work cannot be realized until the ducting/distribution system is also upgraded. The DPW garage roof needs replacement. Bottom line is that our reluctance to provide for capital infrastructure improvements has caught up to us and forced us into funding short term improvements which may have been better spent on longer term alternatives. Together we can make this work. Help us make the right decisions and make the most efficient use of our scarce resources.

We also hung a banner on Roy's Custom Framing and used the Chamber sign board to remind voters of those dates. I think that more education is needed to explain to the voters how the Town functions and the importance of Town Meeting. If you have any specific ideas about this subject, please speak with me. Our Town Meeting is the purest form of a representative government. Let's preserve it. I am entering my 23rd year as your Moderator and once again thank you for that honor.

CEMETERY COMMITTEE



THE CEMETERY COMMITTEE was established in 1991 to advise the Town on the operation, maintenance and preservation of Jaffrey's public cemeteries: Conant, The Old Burying Ground, Cutter, Cutter Extension and Phillips-Heil (also the inactive cemeteries, Village and Smallpox). It is composed of representatives of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Historical Society, Cournoyer Funeral Home, the Board of Selectmen and up to five appointed Members at Large. Randall Heglin, Director of Public Works, and Bruce Hautanen assist the Committee in its work. The *Resolution* establishing the Committee and the *Cemetery Rules and Regulations* are on the Town's website: <http://townofjaffrey.com>

During 2012 the Committee met six times with Town staff to discuss operation, budget and maintenance issues, or to undertake inspections. Each cemetery is overseen by a member of the Committee. This oversight involves inspecting the cemetery from time-to-time and reporting on conditions and problems at Committee meetings. Members of the Committee also participated in several work sessions to 1) straighten headstones; 2) continue the restoration of the cast iron fence surrounding John Conant's grave; and 3) record and photograph the gravestones in Conant Cemetery, Cutter Cemetery and The Old Burying Ground.

Katsura Landscaping continues to do an excellent job of grass cutting, cleanup and grounds maintenance at all the cemeteries.

A Cemetery Trees Trust Fund was established at the 2007 Town Meeting. At last year's Town Meeting, \$2,000 was added to the fund. (In addition \$500 in private contributions have been received.) \$880 was expended in 2012 to pay for tree removal and pruning in Conant and Cutter Cemeteries and The Old Burying Ground. Additional trees including very large white pines will be removed in 2013 if the logistics of the removal can be safely worked out. The balance of the Fund now stands at \$10,406.80.

Minor gravestone repairs and stone straightening were done by volunteers. The stonework at the Bradley gravesite in Conant Cemetery was thoroughly cleaned by John Kaufhold and his crew at Peterborough Marble & Granite. The cost of this was covered by a trust fund established many years ago by Mark Bradley. (This fund also covered the cost of a new storage shed at Conant Cemetery—\$4,605.05—which replaced the deteriorated one at the same location.) Peterborough Marble & Granite also did extensive stone repair and stone re-setting at Conant and Village Cemeteries and repaired one slate headstone in The Old Burying Ground. The cost of this was borne by the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund (\$5,435) and the Bradley Trust (\$2,500). The balance of the Gravestone Restoration Trust Fund is \$2,480.24 as of December 31, 2012. At last year's Town Meeting, \$500 was added to the fund.

Phase VII of the volunteer effort of restoring the iron fencing surrounding John Conant's grave at the cemetery named for him was undertaken by members of the Committee. The scraping and painting were finally completed in the Fall of 2012 after an effort of seven years.

Residents and lot owners are reminded that the Town's Cemetery Rules & Regulations and A Guide to the Public Cemeteries of Jaffrey are available from the Department of Public Works and on the Town website <http://townofjaffrey.com>. The Cemetery Committee has a page on the site under Boards & Committees. Information on some but not all graves in Jaffrey is available on www.jaffreyhistory.org.

The Monadnock and Dublin Garden Clubs—in observance of the Garden Club of America's centennial in 2013—have taken on Cutter Cemetery as a project, restoring and enhancing this cemetery's distinctive sugar maple allées. Seventeen 3-1/2 inch caliper sugar maples were planted in May filling in the vacant spaces. Twenty-five cuttings from the original trees

are now being propagated in a temporary nursery in Cutter Extension. The Committee is appreciative of their efforts and looks forward to admiring the results.

Emily Preston has completed her work of photographing the headstones in Conant Cemetery. Photography continues in The Old Burying Ground and Cutter Cemetery as does database entry.

During 2012, Paul St. Pierre joined the Committee as Genealogist. Paul's wealth of knowledge on Jaffrey families has already proved invaluable in assisting in inquiries.

The Committee thanks those volunteers who have shown an interest in Jaffrey's cemeteries by devoting their time and attention to their care and maintenance over the past year. Dennis Wright kindly donated his services to prepare and paint the flagpole at The Old Burying Ground.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION



The Conservation Commission was established in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated (RSA) 36-A for the proper use and protection of Jaffrey's natural resources and watersheds. The Commission provides a focal point within the town and its government for environmental concerns. The Commission may advise the Planning Board and other local bodies on conservation matters. The Commission may act more directly to protect natural resources by acquiring land, either outright or through easements, with the approval of the Selectmen. The Commission also manages designated town forests.

The Conservation Commission holds regular meetings, open to the public, on the third Wednesday of the month at 7 p.m. in the Town Hall. Our minutes are posted on the Town's website. The Conservation Commission's section of the Town's website also contains detailed information about the Town's conservation areas and a copy of the Natural Resources Inventory which has detailed maps of the resources within the Town of Jaffrey.

2012 was a year of numerous accomplishments for the Conservation Commission. Many projects came to fruition which included support and fundraising for conservation easements, improvements including new structures in Jaffrey's local conservation areas that contain up-to-date maps and brochures, educational programs for commission members and the public, sponsorship of a Jaffrey student for an educational conservation camp and continued monitoring of easement properties.

- In January 2012, the Commission requested and the Planning Board accepted that the NRI be made a part of the Master Plan of the town.
- The Land Acquisition Capital Reserve Fund (LACRF) was funded with \$5,000 at the Town Meeting.
- Children's Woods: Four kiosks were built and installed near entrances to Children's Woods, and with assistance from Monadnock Conservancy, four large trail maps were created and placed in the kiosks. In addition, 14 birdhouses, for woodland birds, ducks and owls were purchased and installed in the southern section of Children's Woods.
- Cheshire Pond Conservation Area: One kiosk and sign designating the area were built and installed at the Old Peterborough – Nutting Road entrance to the CPCA.
- Conservation Easements: Three new conservation easements were completed in 2012 with support and assistance of the Conservation Commission.

Whittemore Island Easement: A conservation easement for Whittemore Island, a 5.4 acre island in Thorndike Pond, was deeded to the Monadnock Conservancy to preserve the island for future generations of paddlers, fishermen and hikers. The island was purchased by the Whittemore family in 1942 to save it from resort development. The family then donated the island to the Nature Conservancy in 1975. In 2012, the Nature Conservancy in coordination with the Monadnock Conservancy, conveyed a deed of conservation restrictions to the town of Jaffrey through the conservation commission.

McKelvie Easement: Parrylyn McKelvie granted a conservation easement as a gift to the Monadnock Conservancy on 18.2 acres within the Town of Jaffrey and fronting on Frost Pond, a public water body. The Conservation Commission provided funds to the Monadnock Conservancy for preparation and recording the easement documents in order to finalize the McKelvie easement.

Shattuck Easement: The Conservation Commission assisted the Monadnock Conservancy in obtaining the final necessary funds to enable completion of a conservation easement on the historic Shattuck Farm property which closed in November 2012. The Conservation Commission sent out a fundraising letter to the citizens of Jaffrey and the citizens responded very generously allowing this easement to be finalized. This property includes prime farmland and a diversity of wildlife habitats and completes a nearly 8,600 acre contiguous block of previously protected land that includes Gap Mountain and Mount Monadnock.

- **Educational Programs:**
The Conservation Commission arranged for and sponsored an educational program by Bear Biologist Ben Kilham to the citizens of Jaffrey with excellent attendance and participation.

The Conservation Commission contributed toward a scholarship for a Jaffrey student to attend Camp Wildwood, the Massachusetts Audubon Society's Conservation Camp.

Two Conservation Commission members attended the annual Saving Special Places workshops including "Legal Nuts and Bolts" and "Enforcing Easements against Violation".

At Riverfest the Conservation Commission presented a display of invasive species along with the NRI base map and wildlife maps. Additional educational material related to conservation, wildlife and nature and recreational areas was on display.

In addition, the Conservation Commission continues to enhance the information on the Town of Jaffrey's website.

- **Monitoring of Easements:**

Grey Goose Easement: The annual monitoring of the Grey Goose Easement was completed by Conservation Commission members.

Whittemore Island Easement: The Conservation Commission in coordination with the Monadnock Conservancy completed the baseline survey.

- **Membership:**

New member Kevin Alix and Alternate member Barbara Alix joined the Conservation Commission in December 2012.

- Regular activities also include review of wetland permit applications, site visits with town committees, and responses for conservation information to town residents.

In 2013, the commission has plans to:

- Enhance current trails in Children's Woods and Cheshire Pond Conservation Area
- Provide additional educational programs for the public and for commission members
- Provide specific information on invasive species including programs to provide control of invasives in specific areas
- Continue to participate in ZBA site visits
- Monitor town easements
- Review DES applications
- Provide information on conservation easements to interested residents

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL



The Economic Development Council (EDC) is made up of business people, community leaders, and local residents with an interest in promoting the economic vitality and growth of Jaffrey. The EDC is committed to promoting business friendly policies and creating business and job opportunities which build on our retail and manufacturing base. Priorities for this year included extension of water service to the Stone Arch Bridge Industrial District, continued improvements to the Downtown including final repairs to the Main Street Dam, ongoing cleanup efforts at the Elite Laundry site.

After many years of service, the EDC regretfully accepted the resignation of Kathy Batchelder. We welcome new members Larry Alvarez, Keith Dupuis and Mike Shea, and returning member Cathy Furze.

Business expansion continues as leased space within several commercial buildings has filled. We now have new tenants at several sites including Ter-rapin Glass, a Zumba studio, Greener Pastures Pet Crematory at Bradco Nine and the Monadnock Unity Building has space as well. The Planning Board approved a limited expansion of the Turnpike Road Industrial District which will accommodate expansion plans for Millipore. While the economy has continued to keep development slow, many of our businesses are improving and adding employees and expanding facilities.



The EDC, Planning Board and TEAM Jaffrey continued outreach and planning for downtown and the route 202/124 “dogleg” traffic improvements, access to of Community Field, and pedestrian



safety. While the traffic improvement project remains on the State’s 10 year transportation plan, the EDC recognizes the importance of gaining consensus and creating a comprehensive plan for downtown.

Under the direction of the DPW and funded through the Downtown Tax Increment Financing District, the Downtown Dam repairs were completed this year. New weir structures were installed and the antique gate wheels were removed and repaired and painted.

The remediation at Elite Laundry is nearing completion with several treatment rounds showing encouraging preliminary results as shown in the table.



Additional injections are planned but the project is moving into the monitoring and redevelopment stage. The EDC and Selectmen are working toward a reuse plan for the site.

Tax Increment Financing Districts

Downtown TIFD:

The Downtown TIFD continues its support of TEAM Jaffrey. Projects this year included the traffic improvements to the route 202/124 “dogleg”; matching funding for the EPA grant for the Elite Laundry cleanup, engineering costs for the downtown dam repairs, and support for the planning for the Community Facility, and bond payments on the purchase of Community Field.

ENERGY COMMITTEE



Noteworthy Energy Committee developments in 2012 included the following:

Town of Jaffrey Energy Initiatives: The Town's efforts on promoting energy conservation, closely monitored by the Energy Committee, included the following in 2012:

- Pellet boilers completed the 2nd year of operation, heating the large process building at the new wastewater plant and realizing an annual savings of approximately \$4,000 versus heating oil.
- The Town completed the 2nd year in cooperation with other communities and school districts in purchasing electricity from Constellation Energy for all Town buildings and town-maintained street lights.
- The Town applied for a Public Utility Commission GHGERF (Greenhouse Gas Energy Recovery Fund) grant for energy conservation measures at the Library, but was not selected in the competitive program. If the grant program becomes available again in 2013, the Town will apply again.
- The Town has been looking towards installation of Solar PV technology at a number of locations.
- The Energy Committee provided suggestions for energy efficient improvements at the Transfer Station and some of the improvements have been incorporated into the 2013 transfer station/recycling center budget.
- The Town has plans in hand to upgrade the downtown lighting with LED's through the Downtown TIFD and this project is moving ahead and should be completed in 2013.

Support for the Monadnock Energy Resources Initiative: With the support and participation of energy committees throughout the Monadnock region, including members of the Jaffrey Energy Committee, the Monadnock Energy Resources Initiative (MERI), a new grassroots non-profit initiative, completed its first all-volunteer, barn-raiser style solar hot water installation at the Nielsen-Rinaldo home in Temple on September 15. MERI will continue to offer solar hot water installations next spring using the neighbors-helping-neighbors, barn-raiser model of all volunteer labor to cut the costs down for solar installations in our region. MERI also has a weatherization project as part of its program.

ENERGY COMMITTEE



Solarize Monadnock: The Solarize Monadnock Program was a grass roots, group bulk purchasing project that was created in early 2012 to benefit Monadnock region residents. Available until December 31, 2012, Solarize Monadnock significantly lowered the costs for solar electric installations through a tiered pricing plan utilizing bulk ordering of parts and installations. This project came into being as a direct result of discussions that were initially hosted by the Jaffrey Energy Committee. As a result of this initiative, PV Modules with an aggregate 71 kW (kilowatt) capacity have been installed on 11 residences.

John O. Field's 5.88 kW solar PV system, installed on the roof of his Jaffrey home as part of the Solarize Monadnock Program and estimated to meet about 93% of the household's electricity needs, is shown below.



Goals and Objectives: The purposes to be served by the Committee are set forth in Article II of its By-Laws as follows: "The Jaffrey Energy Committee, acting as advisor to town officials, the schools, businesses and residents on energy matters, will seek to encourage energy conservation and sustainability (and to save money wherever possible) through the wise use of energy, giving special attention to minimizing carbon dioxide emissions, fossil fuel dependency, and wasteful energy consumption while

maximizing clean renewable energy use. Among numerous critical energy challenges and opportunities, the Committee shall advocate: reduction of energy and environmental waste through smart recycling; reduction of carbon and other harmful fuel emissions through technological innovations and through shifts to alternative energy sources that minimize fossil fuel dependency; reduction of costs of residential, commercial and town lighting through elimination of unnecessary lighting, use of low energy lighting sources, and good lighting management practices; reduction of heating and air conditioning costs in buildings by maximizing energy conservation and efficiency and other performance factors; increase of energy efficiency through reformed building and property development codes; collaboration with other local, state and national organizations, including other town energy committees, to advance the above-stated purposes.”

HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMITTEE



The Jaffrey Historic District Commission was established by the citizens in 1969 to safeguard the heritage of Jaffrey Center by a) preserving a district that reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history, b) conserving property values in the district, c) fostering civic beauty, and d) promoting the use of a historic district for education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens.

In the year 2012, the Historic District Commission met 8 times to discuss business relating to the Commission's ordinance to "regulate the construction, alteration, painting, moving, demolition, or use of the structures and places" within the district. During the year two formal applications were filed.

1 April 5, 2012

HDC Application #96 – Terry Dontje, 385 Main Street, Map 228/Lot 34, Zone: Residence A (with town water) Historic District overlay. The applicant proposes to re-roof the north side of the house with architectural asphalt shingles, replacing existing three tab asphalt shingles.

The motion was made to approve the application from Mr. Terry Dontje for the use of Architectural asphalt shingles as discussed in the Public Hearing. - **APPROVED**

2 May 3, 2012

HDC Application #97 – Jaffrey Meeting House Committee, 15 Laban Ainsworth Way Map 228/Lot68, Zone: Residence A (with town water) Historic District overlay. The applicant proposes to replace pressure treated boards on the ramp to the tower entrance with composite boards.

The motion was made to approve the application from the Jaffrey Meeting House Committee for the use of composite boards on the ramp as discussed in the Public Hearing. - **APPROVED**

In 2011, the Commission submitted a grant application and received funding from The Certified Local Government (CLG) for a walking tour brochure of Squantum Village. This project is a follow up to the Survey Area Form that was done in 2009. This brochure compliments the brochures already available for Jaffrey Center, Downtown Jaffrey and Jaffrey Cemeteries. Copies of these brochures are available at the library and town offices. This project was completed by Rob Stephenson.

HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMITTEE



The Commission co-sponsored the annual event of a reading of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th at the Meetinghouse which was well attended by Jaffrey residents as well as many people from surrounding towns.

The Commission would like to extend its sincere thanks to the residents and neighbors of the District for cooperating and considering the impact any changes to their homes and businesses might have on the overall character of the Historic District.

The Commission would like to thank the Selectmen's Meetinghouse Committee for the continuing coordination and ongoing restoration of the Meetinghouse.

All residents are reminded that the Historic District Commission's regular monthly meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month at 7pm. Winter meetings are held in the Town Office; summer meetings are in the Meetinghouse.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES



The Library circulated a total of 53,277 items in 2012 which included an increase in the borrowing of DVD's and downloadable e-books from the NH State Consortium. Access to the library is still available 24/7. You can view new additions to the collection, request and renew items and receive updates and notices by email. All you need for access is the barcode number on your library card. Our web-site also features access to our catalog, databases, and upcoming events. Check it out at www.townofjaffrey.com/library. We added two new databases this year, Career Transition which provides assistance in job searching and resumes, and Legal Forms which provides access to numerous legal forms from wills to rental agreements.

In April we received an Orion Star Blast 4.5" telescope from the New Hampshire Astronomical Society. The telescope is now available and can be checked out for home use. The Mildred Cutter bequest and Page Fund enabled us to present our Summer Reading program, along with other special programs and material for children. Encouraging reading in our younger users is a high priority at the library. This year our summer reading program encouraged kids to "Dream Big...Read". 129 children met the challenge and read or listened to books for a total of 2,494 hours. We continue to work with the Jaffrey-Rindge Extended Day Program program which provides afterschool activities for elementary and middle school children. In February in cooperation with them we held a workshop in African Drumming led by drummer Gloria Matlock. The drumming was great fun and culminated in a program for the student's parents.

The Friends of the Library helped us by fund raising and by sponsoring speakers, educational events, and the film series. Highlights included a presentation from the Loon Preservation Committee, a traveling exhibit of butterflies brought to us by Magic Wings Conservatory from Deerfield, MA, and a visit from Willa Cather presented by Michelle Barale of Amherst College. The Friends also provided a display case for new books.

Our book discussion group meets monthly and this year participated in the New Hampshire "Big Read" which focused on the works of Edgar Allan Poe. As part of the program we hosted a performance by Eclectic Entertainment called Poe! Poe! Poe! Our knitting group meets every Friday at 10:30 in the Bean Room. Tips on knitting, crocheting, and many crafts are plentiful. The film discussion series lead by Bill Johnson continues to meet every Wednesday evening to a full house.

During this year we were able to make several need repairs to the library building. Thanks to the Bean Fund we replaced the worn and torn carpet in the Bean Reading Room and thanks to the town we were able to replace our boilers and oil tanks when they finally disintegrated in July.

We are thankful for the support of the Town of Jaffrey and for the many gifts and donations we receive from individuals and community organizations. In 2013, we look forward to continuing to provide you with a welcoming library that meets your needs.

MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE



THE MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE advises the Town on matters pertaining to the use and maintenance of Jaffrey's historic Meetinghouse.

The Meetinghouse served as a venue for many events between May and October 2012: Amos Fortune Forum (seven lectures), Monadnock Music concert, 'Music for the Mountain' concerts, Conant High School's 20th annual Shakespeare Festival, the 96th annual First Church Fair, a Midsummer Swedish Festival, the annual meeting of Jaffrey Historical Society, two relocated Downtown Summer Concert Series concerts and seven weddings. Several Town boards and committees met in the Meetinghouse one or more times. The Meetinghouse was also the scene of numerous other meetings, school group visits, and gatherings throughout the year. The Committee along with the Jaffrey Historical Society, the Village Improvement Society and the Historic District Commission co-sponsored the 12th annual reading of The Declaration of Independence on the Fourth of July. The Meetinghouse was again full and the 38 volunteer readers did a marvelous job. All are invited to attend and participate.

The Committee made thorough inspections of the Meetinghouse in May and October. Between these inspections a variety of projects were undertaken, sometimes by members of the Committee and at other times by volunteers or contractors: Inspection and servicing of the Town clock (overseen by Kevin Sterling and with the professional involvement of D'Avanza Clock Repair of Goffstown); annual testing of the fire alarm system by Monadnock Security; and the usual touch-up interior painting, oiling of exterior stairs and ramps and minor plumbing (Devlin & Sons) and electrical repair (Shea Electrical).

Among the major projects in 2012: Dennis Wright and his crew prepared and painted the ceiling and second floor walls in the spring. (This may have been the first time the ceiling has been painted in 90 years.) The Tower entrance ramp was rebuilt by Andrew Webber. The antiquated electric panel was replaced by Shea Electrical which also ran some new cables so that the clock could be put on its own dedicated circuit.

MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE



During 2012 rental fees for the use of the Meetinghouse totaled \$3,775. Capital expenditures totaled \$12,798.50. The balance of the Meetinghouse Trust Fund at the start of the year was \$17,547.86; at the end of the year, \$14,114.92.

For the seventh year a Christmas tree was installed on the Common and a lighting ceremony with caroling was held on December 2nd. As always, candles were set in the south windows of the Meetinghouse for the holiday season.

The Meetinghouse has its own webpage, hosted on the Town's website at <http://townofjaffrey.com>. Go to > Boards & Committees > Meetinghouse Committee. Here you will find, among other things, historical and financial information, photographs, the current and past schedules of events, and the application and guidelines for use.

The calendar for next season is beginning to fill. Other than the usual events, three weddings have already been booked. These and other private gatherings benefit the Town through rental fees.

MONADNOCK ADVISORY COMMISSION



The Monadnock Advisory Commission was created by State Statute and is charged to advise and guide the Department of Resources and Economic Development on the management of State lands and leased lands on Monadnock, Gap and Little Monadnock mountains.

Monadnock Trails week takes place every summer. Working a total of 636 person hours, 37 Volunteers helped 8 staff members complete several trail projects and refurbished several others. Work was also done to trails on Gap Mountain.

Park Staff and volunteers responded to numerous hiker incidents and searches throughout the year. Monadnock State Park Manager, Patrick Hummel, reported a day use of 80,785 at Headquarters and 14,535 at other trail heads. Camping levels were up to 3,039 for Headquarters (group camping sites) and 3,796 at the Gilson Pond Campground.

As a primary funding source for such things as search and rescue equipment and supplies, State law allows MAC to receive donations. Specified donations have been received in past years for such things as blazing trails and signage.

MAC meets twice a year, usually at the Jaffrey Civic Center and dates and times of meetings are listed in area newspapers. The public is welcome to attend these meetings.

SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST



It was an extraordinary year for the Supervisors of the Checklist. There were four elections: Presidential Primary (1/10), Town and School (3/13), State Primary (9/11) and the State General Election (11/6). Gail Landy was appointed Supervisor to take the position held by Barbara Pelkey who resigned mid-year. Ms. Landy will run for office at the 2013 Town and School Elections.

This year the interest in the elections intensified because New Hampshire required photo identification at the State Primary and General Elections. This decision was unsuccessfully challenged in the court, and Supervisors, Clerks and other Election Officials throughout the state received special training on the new regulations and requirements. There was minimal confusion or difficulty in Jaffrey with adopting this new law. Only forty voters out of the 833 (5%) voting in the State Primary did not have or refused to show their photo identification. At the State General Election the 49 voters (2%) who did not have or refused to show their photo identification, present proof of citizenship or domicile were notified by the Attorney General that a vote was cast in their name and asked to confirm in writing that they were the named voter who voted that day.

There was considerable interest in both the State Primary and State General elections in Jaffrey, and Supervisors relied on the volunteer support of past Supervisors and civic-minded residents: Sylvia Hamilton, Betts Balentine, Nancy Isaacs and Steffie Kyte. Every one of those volunteers was important to the success of the State General Election with the historic turn-out of 82% of the town's voters turning out and 435 new voters registering on Election Day. The citizen volunteers logged in over 75 hours at the State General Election alone, registering a new voter every two minutes for 11 hours.

Supervisors of the Checklist, elected officials of the Town, are governed by RSAs and report to the Secretary of State's Office regularly. Supervisors are responsible for the integrity of the voting process for the Town of Jaffrey which includes maintaining an accurate and up-to-date Voter Checklist. Elected for 6 year terms, Supervisors meet in regular and frequent sessions to update the Checklist and register new voters, as well as attend all Town Meetings, School District Deliberative sessions and all local, state and national elections, as well as any Special Elections that may be called. Supervisors also certify signatures on petitioned articles to the Town Warrant and nominations for state and federal offices.

SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST



It has been 9 years since the Help American Vote Act (HAVA) was passed and the State of New Hampshire established a state-wide, electronic Voter Checklist. Supervisors maintain the Town's portion of the state-wide checklist in an online, dedicated file protected by passwords and restricted access. The current Voter Checklist is available on the Town Clerk's bulletin board. Voters may register or make changes to their own records with the Town Clerk during normal business hours or by attending any of the Sessions held throughout the year by Supervisors.

During 2012, Supervisors spent 640 person hours maintaining the Voter Checklist and providing oversight at elections. Supervisors also certified signatures on 6 petitioned articles for the Town Warrant and 2 nominations for state office and the creation of a Libertarian Party.



Daytime hours still continue to be the time of day with limited availability of firefighters as a large majority of our firefighters are not available due to their fulltime jobs.

Six probationary firefighters attended an intense five month long Firefighter I Certification class in 2012. The class included a combination 208 hours of classroom lectures and practical evolutions. At the end of the class the firefighters took a State of NH written and practical skills test and all six students passed their test and received their Firefighter I Certification. Three firefighters attended an 80 hour Hazard Materials Technician course in 2012 that was fully funded by a Homeland Security Grant managed through the NH Fire Academy. The firefighters also participated in a pump operations class and continued to train on fire, rescue, EMS and specialty operations throughout the year. The fire department currently has 25 members including the Fire Chief and we encourage anyone that is interested in becoming a call firefighter to contact the Fire Chief at the fire station. Information on joining the fire department is also available on the fire departments website www.jaffreyfire.org.

We would like to recognize Firefighter James Devlin who retired in May 2012 from the Jaffrey Fire Department with 35 Years of Service. Thank you to Firefighter Devlin for his many years of service to the Fire Department and the Town of Jaffrey.

The majority of the fire department equipment and apparatus is in good condition. The firefighters will continue to maintain and check all of the equipment and apparatus on a weekly basis. The maintenance and equipment checks allow the equipment and apparatus to remain in good condition and in response ready status. We ask you to support two fire department warrant articles this year. The first warrant article is to grant permission to use funds from the fire department capital improvement fund to replace the existing 1960 vintage SCBA Compressor Cascade Filling System equipment that is beyond its useful life span. The second is to grant permission to place funds in the fire department capital improvement fund for future purchases of new or the refurbishing of existing firefighting and/or rescue equipment.

As time goes on the calls for service responded to by the fire department are affected by many different factors. The factors may be manmade, natural, mandated by law, industrial and or residential growth, time of day, available fire department staffing etc. The hope is through continued enforcement of fire and building codes, fire prevention education and fire prevention practices that the need for fire department response will decrease but there

is no way to predict this. The time has come that we need to be proactive and look at the future of the fire department. Information and ideas need to be researched and a plan of action needs to be looked at with open minds which will allow the fire department the ability to be able to respond to the needs of the citizens and visitors of Jaffrey now and in the future.

Smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors need to be installed on every level of your home and additional smoke detectors should be installed in every bedroom and hallway outside of the bedrooms. Please contact the fire department with any questions or if you need help with a fire escape plan or installing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.

The ability to accomplish our mission and the level of service provided by the fire department are made possible by the dedicated firefighters, their families, the retired firefighters, the Jaffrey Firefighters Co., the FAST Squad, local businesses, citizens, taxpayers and all of the fire departments in the area that helped us in a time of need. We thank you for your continued support and assistance.

POLICE DEPARTMENT



2012 turned out to be one of the most challenging years for the Jaffrey Police Department in recent memory on a number of levels.

Letters mailed to the Chamber of Commerce, town officials and a local newspaper containing threats of extreme violence against the tens of thousands of people that come to Jaffrey to attend the Annual Festival of Fireworks resulted in the last minute cancellation of that event. The timing of the delivery of these letters caused the loss of a substantial amount of time and money invested by the sponsors of the event as well as the loss of revenues suffered by those businesses and other entities in town that have benefited from the influx of many thousands of visitors each year. While the investigation is still ongoing involving local, state and federal agencies, the person responsible for this reprehensible act has not yet been identified or held accountable for their actions. A positive aspect of this otherwise terrible act was a demonstration of what I feel to be a trademark of Jaffrey as a community in the form of their resilience. Positive response was almost immediate through support and encouragement by members of the community and the region to those so negatively affected by this incident.

On a different front, my hopes to maintain a full staffing level for the year were not fulfilled. Two officers resigned over the course of the year with a third officer in the advanced stages of a hiring process with another larger agency. Changes in the NH retirement system are having a substantial impact on the pool of interested and qualified applicants. We remain committed to a high standard of professionalism by all members of our department and will conduct our recruitment with that standard in mind, as we have in the past.

In spite of the great success of the School Resource Officer over the past 3 years we are accepting the possibility that the position may not be funded by the school district for the coming 2013-2014 school year. An unfortunate casualty of tightening budgets and priorities.

On a more positive note I want to express the gratitude of our department to Jim Dumont who retired at the end of the 2012 school year after serving 8 years seeing to the safe passage of our school children to and from school. I would also like to recognize and thank Dennis Wright of Wright Painting. Dennis saw the deteriorating condition of the cupola topping the police

department and donated the labor of his crew and materials to scrape and repaint the cupola, much improving the look of a facility so prominently situated in the downtown area.

Putting 2012 behind us we look forward to a new year with the continuing commitment of our department to provide the citizens of Jaffrey and all those that pass through its borders a safe and inviting environment.

PROSECUTOR'S DEPARTMENT



Despite a slight reduction in arrests by the police department, the Town of Jaffrey continues to be a leader in the number of cases submitted to the local court for prosecution. Our legal assistant, Michelle Szalanski, has initiated a system that more diligently monitors open cases to ensure that defendants are in compliance with court orders. Budget driven legislation has led to many changes in existing law and we have worked closely with Court, local and state officials to adapt to, and implement these changes. We are still feeling the effects of dramatic changes in the Juvenile Laws which has resulted in a somewhat smaller case load, but not necessarily a reduction in the amount of incidents, inquiries, or requests for assistance. The court system has initiated a pre-trial hearing process on all minor traffic cases which has proven to be beneficial in resolving most of those cases without a trial. Additionally, police officers are not required to attend the pre-trial hearings thereby contributing to a reduction in police overtime expenses for their respective communities.

Our office has continued to participate in student intern and study programs working with students from Wheelock College, Mount Wachusett Community College and Franklin Pierce University.

Simple assaults, suspended driver's licenses, domestic issues, drug and alcohol related offenses and trespassing remain as the most common types of cases that we prosecute.

In all areas of offenses we have had \$ 75,524.05 in restitution ordered to be paid to victims through the Court, Department of Corrections or through our office. Additionally, in most cases where a defendant fails to appear and officers appear at court, witness fees are generally assessed and paid to the town's general fund.

In 2012 we received revenue in the amount of \$ 760.00 through the collection of discovery fees.

Cemeteries/Parks and Commons Division: In 2012, the Town performed 5 full-body and 7 cremation burials. The staff assisted and participated with the Cemetery Committee by attending regular meetings, work sessions and the annual cleanup. Staff also assisted the Committee with continuing work on the Cutter Cemetery expansion. Annual cemetery cleanup day was performed in November which removed materials from gravesites in preparation for winter and those that do not comply with the regulations to improve the general appearance of the facilities. The Town continued contracting out landscaping maintenance activities to a private contractor. Staff completed a cemetery lot inventory program for Conant Cemetery (photo and lot records) through the continued invaluable assistance of Emily Preston. As a reminder to those who have loved ones buried in the cemeteries, artificial flowers are not permitted. These arrangements get entangled in the landscaping equipment and are a serious hazard to the workers.

Highway Division: In 2012, the Highway Department paved Hadley Road north of Old Sharon Road and paved First Tavern Road. Highway Crews performed winter and summer (seasonal) maintenance on over 64 miles of Town roads (including 20 miles of gravel road) and assisted other Departments throughout the year including the Water, Sewer, Solid Waste, Recreation, Fire and Police.

As reported last year, engineering plans, specifications and bid documents were prepared for culvert rehabilitation at the Gilmore Pond Road bridge as a result of deficiencies cited by NHDOT and inclusion on the state's municipal "red list" and following receipt of competitive bids, the project was awarded to Van Dyke Construction and was completed last winter.

The gate replacement project at the Main Street Dam was completed last summer by Lydon Company with assistance from the Highway Department. Two (2) new gates and control mechanisms were installed that now allow for regulation of upstream flow in the Contoocook River in the event of storm or flooding events. The old gate mechanisms were removed, scraped and painted, and placed back at the dam (not operational). Following successful completion of this project, Lydon Company was contracted with again to replace the single gate at the Mountain Brook Reservoir Dam. This project should be completed by early summer this year.

The Mechanic with assistance from Highway staff maintained and kept operational the Town's vehicles and in addition to maintaining highway

vehicles, over 217 hours of labor was expended maintaining Fire, Police, Water, Sewer, and Recreation Department vehicles and equipment.

Wastewater Division: In 2012, the wastewater treatment plant processed approximately 187,561,000 gallons (average 513,866 gallons per day) of wastewater from 803 connections. United Water of Auburn, NH is in the seventh year of contract operations of the sewer facilities including the wastewater treatment plant, Hadley Road head works, 5 pump stations and 15 miles of collection sewer.

As part of their normal operations, United Water completed cleaning of approximately 16,000 linear feet of collection sewer and repaired 18 manholes during the year. The sewer cleaning program is part of a preventive maintenance program begun in 2004 addressing the sanitary sewer collection system,

manholes and pump

stations. During 2012, there were 15 callouts for sewer related problems (blockages or overflows).

The Town completed the third full year of operation of the advanced wastewater treatment plant and first full year of operation of the filtration system providing tertiary treatment both built to comply with NPDES requirements and an EPA Administrative Order to meet more stringent effluent standards.

Total septage waste received at the new wastewater plant during 2012 was 1,550,980 gallons (equivalent to about 1,550 - 1,000 gallon residential septage holding tanks).

Total sludge processed at the wastewater plant in 2012, was 154.41 dry tons. The dewatered sludge was transported to the Merrimack, NH wastewater plant composting facility where it was composted for beneficial reuse.

As reported last year, the Town continued working on the system-wide infiltration/inflow program. Examined were potential areas of infiltration (ground water entering the system through leaks in manholes and sewer mains) and inflow (non-sewage related drainage and sump pumps from private properties). DPW and wastewater staff completed an update of collection system documents and older planning documents and completed additional field work including video inspection, flow isolation and inspection of manholes. A two-year rehabilitation program was initiated in priority areas identified and during 2012, a total of 2,464 linear feet of sanitary sewer was lined, and 16 service lateral repairs were made.

As reported last year, the Town was advised by DES that replacement of the River Street and Nelson Circle sewer pump stations are eligible for funding (40%) from the State of New Hampshire CWSRF to supplement local funds that had been previously appropriated. Engineering design, survey and preparation of bidding documents is well underway and the project is expected to be competitively bid and completed this year.

Water Division: In 2012, the Department produced 118,263,877 gallons (average 323,125 gallons per day) from four (4) groundwater wells at the Contoocook, Turnpike wells, and the new Squantum well and provided potable drinking water and fire protection to approximately 1,450 accounts in Jaffrey and Rindge. The Department responded to four (4) water main breaks and three (3) service breaks. Hydrant maintenance continued with the maintenance of 12 hydrants and there were five (5) curb box and rod repairs. Hydrants were flushed twice during the year (spring and fall). Thirty-two (32) new meters were installed or replaced, and thirty-eight (38) water meters were reprogrammed.

As reported last year the town contracted with Wachs, Inc. in 2011 to complete a leak detection survey of the water distribution system. Report findings have allowed the town to initiate a program to locate potential system water leaks and make the appropriate repairs. During 2012, M2 Services provided similar leak detection services and two (2) hydrant leaks and one (1) significant service leak were repaired.

Continued Cross Connection and Backflow Testing Program with town staff and a contractor to complete mandatory semi-annual testing of all ninety-two backflow prevention devices in town.

Implemented Bullet Pond Forest Management Plan and selective cutting was performed during 2012. This work is intended to improve the overall health and vitality of the forest.

As reported last year, engineering design and specifications for extending water to Old Sharon Road (Stone Bridge TIFD) were completed and last spring, the Town was able to obtain project funding from the USEDA. EDA committed to 50% of the project cost with the balance from payments from the tax increment finance district. The project was bid and awarded to DBU Construction (Epsom, NH) in October. Significant progress was made and the project is expected to be complete in the spring. Municipal water is being extended from DD Bean on Peterborough Street to Hadley Road, and Old Sharon Road, ending at Maria Drive.

Construction of the Squantum Road Well was completed. This project provided for construction of a well house and groundwater treatment consisting of disinfection, pH adjustment and corrosion control. The project is funded in part by the DES DWSRF program with a 40% grant.

Engineering Division: In 2012, the engineering division provided assistance to all Department of Public Works functions as well as other town

departments and committees as necessary including the Energy Committee and Joint Loss Management Control Committee. Special projects included the final phase of preparing GIS/GPS locating and mapping of the water and sewer system physical structures; sewer infiltration/inflow program; leak detection study of the water distribution system; Cemetery inventory program; Main Street Dam gate replacement project; Gilmore Pond Road bridge/culvert replacement; Gilmore Road stone arch bridge repairs; and, Mountain Brook Reservoir Dam Emergency Action Plan (EAP);

As was the case last year, a good deal of time was spent coordinating operations and troubleshooting the advanced wastewater treatment plant with the wastewater filtration system. An aluminum study was completed as per an Administrative Order from EPA to evaluate our ability to comply with a more stringent aluminum effluent limit. Data was collected from the collection system and treatment plant and the study concluded that the treatment plant was in compliance with the new aluminum limit year-round and EPA closed the order.

Coordinated construction administration and inspection of the new Squantum Road Well project which was completed during the year and put on line last fall. The project is being supported by a 40% grant from the DES DWSRF Program. Engineering design and specifications were finalized for the Old Sharon Road/Stone Bridge TIFD project which was advertised and competitive bids were received and the project was awarded to DBU Construction and is currently under construction with

completion expected during the spring of 2013. The project is being supported by a 50% grant from EDA.

The division continued to work with the DES Dam Bureau on dam inspections and updating of operations and maintenance and emergency operations plans. New gates were received for the

work at the Main Street Dam (replacement of the gates and operators) and the contracted with Lydon Company who completed the work last summer. Currently working with Lydon Company to replace the gate at the Mountain Brook Reservoir Dam in 2013.

Coordinated environmental testing and response to DES following discovery of bullet fragments at the Contoocook Lake town beach.

Support was provided to the Planning Board as needed by reviewing site and subdivision plans, inspecting development projects, preparing bond recommendations for projects incorporating public improvements and approving as-built plans.

Solid Waste/Transfer/Recycling Division: Material received and processed at the Transfer Station in 2012 included the following approximate amounts: 877 tons compactor waste, 621 tons bulky waste including construction and demolition debris, 190 tons recycled material (plastics, paper, corrugated), 63 tons light iron, 10 tons aluminum, 279 televisions, 76 computer monitors, 16 VCR's, 7 DVD players, 61 microwaves, 2 trailer loads of tires, 112 propane tanks, 40 batteries, and 96 Freon containing items.

The Department continues to address operational and environmental recommendations presented by the Board of Selectmen's citizen advisory committee in 2004. Plans to cover and improve the bulky waste drop off area and replace and insulate the transfer station roof are incorporated in the Town's Capital Improvement Plan. Recent annual reports from DES indicated that Jaffrey's recycling rate continues to exceed the statewide average. The town continues to participate in a regional Household Hazardous Waste disposal program offered in Keene with collections held during summer and fall. The town in cooperation with DES, EPA and DEA has sponsored prescription drug take-back days at the Jaffrey Police Department as well as area police departments in accordance with a national program to promote safe drug disposal and keeping discarded drugs from solid waste and wastewater.

Disposal of solid waste was bid out in 2012. MDS of Jaffrey continues to provide disposal services to the town.

The staff continues to check for valid “dump” stickers and remind all that stickers can be obtained at both the Town Clerk’s office and at the Transfer Station with a proof of residency. Seasonal stickers can be obtained at the DPW office.

We continue to process commodities through the NRRA, which competitively bids commodities and insures the best prices for their members. Throughout this year, we have seen the prices received for recyclables remain dismal. We are attempting to stockpile some recyclables until the market improves as we are able to receive more favorable pricing if full loads of the same commodity are sent to the vendor. Estimated net revenue received from the sale of these commodities totaled \$ 28,327 in 2012. And, by actively recycling, the town also saved over \$25,000 by not disposing of recyclable items along with household trash. Following is a summary of the materials processed at the Transfer Station last year:

RECREATION DEPARTMENT



At a recent Northern New England Recreation and Parks Conference, one of the sessions centered on how Parks and Recreation Departments contributed to the building of the community and the unique position of a department to build the citizen of tomorrow. I thought about this point and realized that our department should be evaluated on the value we provide to the community. Do we offer a good “return on investment” to our clients, the residents and taxpayers of Jaffrey? Do we offer a wide variety of programs to all of our residents? Do we offer clean, safe, and inviting recreation areas where users can relax and have fun? Are we exploring new and innovative ways of funding our programs and facilities? I think the answer to all of these questions is, YES!

During 2012, the department purchased a replacement mini-bus. This \$18,000 purchase was done by user-fees only and did not come from your taxes. During the summer, free breakfasts and lunches were provided to our summer program participants at no charge to the children under a federal grant. By using funding available through the 21st Century Grant, approximately 100 children attended programs at no charge this past summer. Our programs provide jobs for lifeguards, program leaders, concession workers, and other seasonal and part time staff. Most of these positions are supported through program user fees and do not utilize tax dollars while providing jobs for the youth in our community.

The department offered programs to participants from 3 years of age through senior citizens in our community and programs included sports, social activities, and trips. We maintained locations where you could swim, boat, ride bikes, run, hike, play sports, spend quality time with your family, or just relax by yourself. So you see, even if you did not participate in programs offered by the department, you more than likely have used facilities maintained by the department.

Our department utilized over 100 volunteers this year! They helped with youth programs, special events, maintaining our facilities and many other tasks. These volunteers were middle and high school students, teachers, parents, and other community members that just wanted to “make a difference” and help contribute to the building of our community.



Origin: In 1749 this territory was chartered as Monadnock Number 2, sometimes called Middle Monadnock or Middletown. It was one of the first towns established under the New Hampshire proprietors' purchase of undivided lands under the Masonian claim. The grant was renewed in 1767, and the town incorporated in 1773 as Jaffrey, in honor of George Jaffrey, member of a prominent Portsmouth family. Both his father and son were named George, and all three served as treasurer of the province. George Senior held the position when the state was still under Massachusetts rule. George III also served as proprietors' clerk, and was a life trustee of Dartmouth College, providing the design for the official college seal.

Population Trends: Population change for Jaffrey totaled 2,303 over 50 years, from 3,154 in 1960 to 5,457 in 2010. The largest decennial percent change was a 30 percent increase between 1970 and 1980, followed by a 24 percent increase over the next decade. The 2010 Census estimate for Jaffrey was 5,457 residents, which ranked 60th among New Hampshire's incorporated cities and towns.

Population Density and Land Area, 2010 (US Census Bureau): 142.4 persons per square mile of land area. Jaffrey contains 38.3 square miles of land area and 1.7 square miles of inland water area.
